Local Volunteer Bushfire Brigades Gear Up for the Upcoming Fire Season

Dardanup's 8 bushfire brigades have been busy preparing for the coming fire season. September 23rd, Kings birthday long weekend, we had Dardanup's 8 bushfire brigades along with Brunswick, Eaton and Bunbury Fire and Rescue brigades, Incident Control Van and DFES staff to conduct a Rural Urban Interface (RUI) at Dardanup West. This was to look at the preparedness of the community, check if our fire trucks can access property drive ways, whether the truck has space to turn around and get access to water tanks to safely defend a structure without risking the safety of our volunteers. This exercise gave us the opportunity to refresh our volunteers on radio communications and logging and recording radio traffic during the exercise.

Brigades have also been doing driver training, ie, four wheel driving and on road emergency driving.

Bushfire Preparedness is important at this time of the year. Perfect time to get your property in order, helps us to help you. If we can't get a full size fire truck onto your property, because of over grown trees and other obstacles we are unable to protect your property in the event of a bushfire. We need at least 4 meters wide

and 4 meters high, for our largest fire trucks to enter your property. Clear zones around your homes and sheds, so in the event of a fire impacting your property our firefighters can safely defend your property. All properties should have some practical firefighting equipment to protect themselves in the event we can't send a fire truck to help because either it is too late to enter safely or simply not enough fire trucks to go around. Fire breaks need to be clear and accessible. Have a plan to leave early if you are not prepared to stay and actively defend your property. Have an Emergency kit. Keep up to date with ABC radio and Emergency WA. Get your Bushfire Preparation TOOLKIT from your local brigade, DFES office and will be available at the Bull and Barrel at the Central Bushfire brigades stall on the oval.

For property owners needing advice on property preparedness, consider contacting your area FCO.

Keep up to date with the Shire of Dardanup fire prevention order, you will find this on the shire website under fire management.

Firebreaks & Fire Prevention Measures

Fire prevention measures must be completed and all properties (including residential, commercial, industrial and vacant land) cleared of fire hazards on or before 30 November each year to reduce the risk of fires during the bushfire season. Properties must remain free of hazard until the close of the Restricted Burning Period.

Shire of Dardanup Rangers commence property inspections on 1 December each year to ensure all properties comply

on 1 December each year to ensure all properties comply with the Fire Prevention Order hire of Dardanup advises property owners each year by way of advertising in the local newspaper, website and mailing of a reminder postcard.

Trains Back On the Track Through Dardanup?

The recent meeting on 20 September in the Dardanup Hall organised by mining company Talison Lithium and the South West Development Commission to discuss a proposal to recommission the Greenbushes to Bunbury Railway Line was well attended by the community.

The rail line hasn't been used for more than 15 years however a \$6.6 million feasibility study has been funded by the State Government and Talison Lithium to investigate the possibility of trains once again travelling on the track between Greenbushes and Picton or the Port, acknowledging the potential growth in the lithium industry and the opportunity to reduce the number of trucks using South Western Highway.

They are hoping to finish the feasibility study mid next year and if going ahead, then operational 12 - 18 months after that.

The Dardanup and Districts Residents Assoc wants to ensure the safety of this community with regards to trains travelling through the town and across many crossings in the localities. There will be 1 train every 3 hours – 4 trains travelling to Picton and 4 travelling back to Green bushes in a 24 hour period.

At the very least I think we should expect Flashing lights and boom gates on all crossings in the Shire, Railway line fenced all the way from the Catholic church to the Vets and complete remodeling of the Venn, Boyanup /Picton, Ferguson Rds intersection.

The DDRA intends liaising with the Shire Council and stakeholders on this issue and will keep the community informed on our progress.

Jarrah forest is a riot of colour as we enter 'Kambarang' the Noongar season from October to November. The fruit tree blossoms are fading and the

trees have begun to dress in their best greens ready for the warmer months. The weeds are wild and I am very busy in my vegie patch.

Now is our prime planting period in the vegie patch and sometimes we can get a bit over enthusiastic and plant everything at once. It is helpful to remember that what you plant now will be ready at Christmas time. a plentiful supply is good but a glut in peak holiday season can be overwhelming! This is when a plan for succession plantings helps to keep your garden productive but not unmanageable. Yes, there are thousands of ways to use zucchini but I'm not sure everyone wants to receive them as Christmas gifts... What is Succession planting? It is a strategy where you stagger sowing seeds or seedlings so that you have plants maturing at different times. For quick growing crops it can be planting some weekly or fortnightly, with other crops it can be planting twice in one season. This technique works for any sized garden. If you love your summer salads a great tip to remember is Leafy greens can be planted with everything and are great used as 'space fillers' and act as living mulch. **Plant once per season.** Crops that take a long time to grow are generally only planted once and will mature with one extended crop for the entire summer season. These include Tomatoes, Eggplant, Chilli, Capsicum, Pumpkin, Sunflower, Luffa, Melons, Squash, Pumpkins & Silverbeet. Investigate your varieties - how many days to maturity do they need? Make sure you have enough days for your pumpkins to cure on the vine if you want to keep them for storage next winter. It helps to plant a few different types of tomatoes so you get a season long harvest. There are early, mid and late fruiting types. Plant Twice per season. Crops that have a shorter time to maturity can be planted twice and this will extend your harvest easy. Learn how to increase soil fertility and soil health in your through into the autumn months. These crops include Zucchini, Corn, Dwarf Beans, Climbing Beans, Snow peas,

I love this time of year, our local Christmas. Mulch well. Choose a sunny, sheltered position. Soaking the seeds before planting will speed up germination. Planting both dwarf and climbing beans/peas will give you a longer harvest period. I plant my next succession crop once the first lot begins to flower.

> Plant every 2-4 weeks. Quicker growing crops such as Lettuce, Asian greens, Cress, Rocket and Coriander can be planted every 2-4 weeks to allow for a continuous harvest. They prefer a sheltered, cool, shaded position or will 'bolt' in the heat. If you are looking to grow smaller amounts but have a consistent supply then seedlings are a great option. They are quick growing and great fillers, just pop in a punnet each week. Seed packets are a cheaper option long term for Leafy crops such as rocket and lettuce, simply scatter seeds in gaps of other plantings. Let a few plants go to seed at the end of the season and you won't need to buy seeds again. What can we plant in October? Just about everything!

Leaf crops - Amaranth, Lettuce, Mustard, Silverbeet, Fennel, Celery, Watercress, Purslane, Rocket, French Cress, Sorrel, NZ spinach, Chicory, Cabbage, Chinese cabbage Root & onion crops - Beetroot, Radish, Kohlrabi, carrot, Parsnip, Scorzonera, Turnip, Celeriac, Daikon, Potato, Leeks, Spring Onions, Yacon, Yam/Oca, Jerusalem Artichoke Legume crops - Dwarf Beans, Climbing Beans, Snow peas, Asparagus pea

<u>Curcubit & Solanum family</u> - Cucumber, Luffa, Sweetcorn, Gourd, Melons, Pumpkin, Squash, Marrow, Zucchini, Tomato, Capsicum, Chilli, Tomatillo, Eggplant, Okra, Rosella, Sunflower. Herbs - Globe Artichoke, Asparagus, Basil, Buckwheat, Coriander, Strawberry plants, Dill, Borage, Nasturtium, Oregano, Sage, Cape Gooseberry, Mint, Tarragon, Lemon Balm, Edible Chrysanthemum, Parsley, Rhubarb, Rosemary and Summer savoury



FOCUS ON MENTAL HEALTH & WELLBEING AT DARDANUP PRIMARY

Abbey Piggott (Mindfulness Educator and Coach) has been running a fortnightly one-hour session on understanding the science behind how the mind works and ways to better manage change and challenges during this term. She has developed a series of empowering programs aimed at children and teens to counteract the effects of stress and anxiety on the developing brain. Our Yr. 6 students have had the opportunity to learn and further develop their understanding of what mental fitness is and ways to build resilience as they enter their final semester of primary school. An overview of her program demonstrates the range of sessions.



Session 5: Bringing it all together: My personal reminders of what works for me to build my mental fitness.

Session 1: Introduction to Mindfulness and Mental Fitness: What anxiety/stress are (Eustress and Distress), how it shows up differently for different people. How the brain works with thought and emotion.

Session 2: Resilience strategies. • How our brains perceive change, our thoughts are the key for success. • Mindfulness tools to help when we feel not ok.

Session 3: Getting to know me Part 1.: Relationships with others, celebrating our differences (building self-esteem and confidence).

Session 4: Getting to know me Part 2: My talents and strengths, awareness of self (focus on self-esteem and confidence).

Storm Damage to the Wells Recreations Park Clubrooms

The Shire of Dardanup would like to advise that the recent storm events have unfortunately caused damage to the Wells Recreation Building in the Dardanup townsite.

Staff are working to clean up the debris as quick as possible. The Shire of Dardanup are also working with the local community, affected community groups and relevant insurers to ensure the damage is assessed and repaired as quickly as possible. Our team is working with the Bull and Barrel Festival Committee to ensure the event can go ahead with minimal disruption. Ongoing work to restore roads and clean-up areas affected by the storms will continue throughout the Shire along with assessments being carried out where needed. We encourage residents to take care on the roads.

Shire of Dardanup Green Waste Collection

The Shire of Dardanup will be conducting a Green Waste collection for residential properties in the townsites of Eaton, Millbridge, Burekup and Dardanup, between the following dates:

Monday, 16 October - 21 October 2023 We will collect:

- Tree and shrub cuttings up to 2 cubic metres
- Maximum length 1.5m
 Maximum diameter 200mm

We cannot collect:

- Lawn clippings or roll on turf
- Green waste placed in bags or boxes
- Hard waste including timber
- Stumps

Excessively large piles of green waste (greater than 2 cubic metres) All green waste must be placed on the verge prior to 6.00am of the first collection day. Council is unable to provide exact collection days or times.

100 per cent of the green waste collected is recycled into compost. Please keep all waste clear of reticulation, water mains, electrical domes, footpaths, street signs and street corners.

The property owner is responsible for maintaining the waste piles in a safe condition and in a manner that does not cause litter.

Waste shall only be placed on the owner's property. Uncollected material remains the responsibility of the property owner/occupier to remove.

Streets will only be serviced once. Green waste placed out AFTER the collection date or not collected remains the responsibility of the owner to remove.

Important Shire Information

The verge-side bulk green waste collection is scheduled for 16-20th October, Shire wide. The Shire permits waste to be placed on the verge no more than 7 days before, this would be the 9th October. This will keep the town tidy for the Festival and prevent early tipping, which is not permitted through our Thoroughfares Local Law.

REMINDER TO DRIVE SAFETY THROUGH ROADWORKS

The Shire of Dardanup has issued a reminder to the community to please exercise additional caution and patience when travelling through local roads works associated with construction of the Bunbury Outer Ring Road (BORR).

Shire of Dardanup CEO André Schönfeldt said of particular concern was the safety of drivers and Shire work crews on rural road Dowdells Line in Henty, near Dardanup.

Road closures and detours in the area associated with construction of the BORR by Main Roads WA contractor South West Gateway Alliance, had increased the amount and type of vehicles using Dowdells Line. This was accelerating deterioration of the road in places.

"Dowdell's Line is a narrow, rural road but has now become a major thoroughfare," Mr Schönfeldt said.

"Our works crews are seeing increasing frustration from motorists in the area who are not adhering to speed limits.

"For the safety of road users and our work crews, I urge the community to please drive carefully in accordance with the signs and conditions of the road."

Mr Schönfeldt said the Shire was continuing to work with Main Roads and South West Gateway Alliance on appropriate solutions for improving safety and access in the area for the remainder of the BORR construction period.

Our Market day is always held on the 4th Sunday of each month except the 3rd Sunday in December, our, next market is 22nd October, 2023


