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### Introduction

The balancing act of preparing our community for the challenges of the digital age while providing the essential and universal library services is a continual challenge at Shire of Dardanup Library Services. While key services and objectives such as increasing literacy and providing learning and knowledge to our community will always be at the core of what we do, an increasing demand for access through our eLibrary and outreach, growing need for adaptive learning spaces at Eaton and Dardanup, and changes to work and life patterns within the community requires the library to develop new strategies.

Additionally, population forecasts for the Shire of Dardanup demonstrate a need to expand our local library facilities while the ceasing of ties with Eaton Community College has built an urgency to move to new premises. The library, therefore, can take advantage of the planned move to unshared facilities by providing a dedicated community service that will create more programming and learning opportunities. We can focus on better access and engagement for the community to explore our high quality collection and benefit from our services.

Moreover, it is important now that the Shire of Dardanup Library Services meet this challenge and move beyond the doors of our branch locations and out into our community. While we have already taken steps to do this through our Library Delivery service, this will be an opportunity to explore ways of utilising assets and venues within the Shire with library programs such as Story Time in the Park.

Shire of Dardanup Library Services enrich the lives of many. Our services have opened doors and expanded horizons through access to information, knowledge, technology, and social interaction in our community. We maintain a welcoming environment that encourages others to participate, inspiring life-long learning through a love of reading and discovery in everyone, from the youngest children to the wisest adults.

Shire of Dardanup Library Services continues to achieve these goals through:


- a) the role our libraries play as a community and social hub;


#### **Overview:**

The COVID-19 pandemic has had an impact on the way our library is used. As expected, there were reduced library visits and supply of stock was reduced due to lockdown periods and border closures. Despite this however, our membership continued to grow as did our loans, highlighting the success of our services during the pandemic. Significantly, our digital loans have increased during this period as more of our customers took advantage of our eLibrary while our home delivery service ensured customers were able to access physical items even while we were closed.


#### **Memberships 2018-2020**




#### Local Stock 2018 - 2020

Our membership trends illustrate a continued growth, particularly in adult and senior memberships. While there has been a drop in the number of junior and young adult members suggesting a need to focus on growing membership in this area, our stock levels have remained consistent which indicates junior members are borrowing on parent accounts which have a maximum limit of 30 items. COVID-19 has also impacted this with parents ordering items for children during lockdown. Additional to this, while our loans to visit ratio remained consistent in 2018 and 2019, there was a large and expected drop in 2020 due to the COVID crisis. However, due to the success of our home order and delivery service, Shire of Dardanup Library Services was able to provide significantly more loans to its customers in 2020 than in previous years.

#### **Benchmarking**

As illustrated below, State Library and National Public Library averages indicate a consistent decline in library use over the past four years which is in contrast to the trends shown through our library service which has shown a consistent increase. A further indication that the Shire of Dardanup provides a higher value library services to its customers is the loans per visit which shows a significantly larger ratio than the national and state averages in 2020.

#### **Community Groups**

As part of our adult library programming, Shire of Dardanup Library Services also offers a free meeting place for local community groups to come together. These groups are open to all members of the community to attend and provide for a greater range of interests within our community.

These groups are oriented to adults and are run on either a weekly or monthly basis.

- **Eaton Art Group:** a monthly topic is set and the attendees each interpret their own style to the topic.
- **Book Lovers:** this is a very organised group of ladies who love to read. They order book packs from the Eastern States and will have one book per month to read. They meet once a month to discuss the book in detail and to receive their next book to read.
- **Bridge:** all players need to complete the beginner's course prior to joining this group. The Bridge game offers intellectual and social stimulation.

#### **Technology and Digital Literacy**

## **Programming for the Future**

While our programming has been designed to cater for as many people in our community as possible, there are some holes. The recent Community Scorecard responses have highlighted this further, particularly in relation to our programming for high school aged children. While our current programming does include activities that cater for this age group, our service needs to more explicitly target this group with events and programs to suit directly.

Additional to this, our programming needs to be made available to everyone in our community. We have taken steps to move outside the library with Story Time in the Park and also our library delivery service, however, a program with a stronger focus on external events and activites needs to be developed integrating Burekup and Dardanup in particular.

#### **Young Adult Programs**

As noted above, the Young Adult demographic has been highlighted in library and community surveys as a group who are underserved by our library. Unfortunately our location as a part of Eaton Community College works against us in many ways as students are reluctant to return to their school during their own free time. However, the move to new locations provides an opportunity to target and engage with this demographic in a meaningful way through our programming. The inclusion of new technologies such as virtual reality gaming machines and a 3D printer will create programming opportunities that will directly entice this age group to engage with the library. Furthermore, other programs currently being run including LEGO club and arts and crafts workshops will be developed to target this age group specifically.

#### Library in the Community

Our new interim library facility is a smaller space that what we currently require however this in iteself creates an opportunity for our library programs to move out and beyond walls of our branch locations. In addition to the continuation of our Story Time in the Park program our events will be utilising other venues around the Shire of Dardanup. This will include more programming in Dardanup and Burekup communities themselves using the hall and parks. These pop-up events will cater for all demographics.

#### **Promotion and Communications**

Our communications and promotions will also extend to utilising more channels. Currently the bulk of our promotion is run through our online tools including social media and web, however, more traditional tools will also be used. This will include community radio, press advertising, and posters. We will also be utilising our own services such as library deliveries to promote our programs and events throughout the community.

## **Looking to the Future**

Through our library goals and meeting key strategic community objectives, Shire of Dardanup Library Services continues to provide traditional library services for the community. However, the growing demands for accessibility and the opportunities and challenges of the digital age highlights the need for new strategies and services to be made available.

Our short term focus, therefore, is to continue building on our current services to provide a more accessible library for our community. This will include moving beyond the library walls and going out into our community through the continuation of our delivery service, participation at local events and more expansion of our programs and activities. We will also continue to develop our current programs and use them to engage in a more meaningful way with our community. Furthermore, by incorporating local history programming into our monthly timetable we hope to build a group of interested volunteers who may assist with the development of our local history collection for the future. We will remain a strategic part of the South West Library Consortia (SWLC) and One Library System and continue to build ties with neighbouring library services and local government organisations.

The expected move to new facilities will eliminate the current squeeze from Eaton Community College and open up new opportunities and new patronage from customers in Eaton. The establishment of a maker space will also enable the library to provide more resources for our community to learn and use new technologies as they become available.

Over the next two to five years, we will look to develop our service by incorporating RFID and self-checkout kiosks. This will enable staff to provide better assistance with technology and reader's advisory, build on our programs and offer more opportunities to bridge literacy gaps in our community, including digital literacy and early childhood literacy. We will also be looking to build on our local history collection which will require a more focused effort to build awareness in both the community and stakeholders within the Shire of Dardanup.
