



Collection Notice – Safety and Emergency Management

The Shire of Dardanup (the Shire) may collect your personal information when you make an application regarding a firebreak exemption, when reporting an incident, applying for membership to the Volunteer Bushfire Brigade, or other safety and emergency matters. This notice explains how the Shire collects and handles your personal information in accordance with the *Privacy and Responsible Information Sharing Act 2024* (WA).

What Personal Information does the Shire collect?

This will vary depending upon the type of assistance you require and the matter being dealt with. Information that the Shire may collect includes:

- Name, Date of Birth, Contact Details and location
- Information about your property
- Information regarding the incident you are reporting
- Medical/injury information
- Information regarding education, qualifications and training
- Sensitive information relating to criminal history and convictions
- Details about your work history and personal activities

This information will normally be collected directly from you, usually via forms and documents provided to the Shire. However in some instances the Shire may collect your personal information from other government agencies, or through authorised 3rd parties.

What is the purpose of collecting this Personal Information? What will it be used for?

We collect this information to:

- Contact you or an authorised third party about your application, query or report
- Communicate with you to process your application
- Assist with Shire investigations relating to breaches of Local Laws
- Issue infringements and assist with debt recovery
- Plan and report on Shire services

The Shire may also use your contact information to update its name and address database, to make it easier to contact you in future regarding other Shire matters.

Will my Personal Information be disclosed to anyone else?

The Shire will only share personal information externally in certain circumstances, including:

- Where you consent to us sharing this information
- With other agencies as part of the Shire's compliance and auditing responsibilities
- Where required to or authorised by law
- When part of an Information Sharing Agreement with another government entity.
- With the Shire's legal representatives in related matters
- With government bodies for reporting and statistical purposes (any shared information will be de-identified).

What will happen if I don't provide this Personal Information?

For general information, to report an incident, or make a complaint to the Shire you can generally do so anonymously without needing provide personal information. In these circumstances please be advised that the Shire may not be able to provide you with a follow up or response to your report or enquiry.

As per s9.11 of the *Local Government Act 1995* (WA), an authorised officer of the Shire may demand an individual's name, place of residence, and date of birth in circumstances where they suspect that individual of having committed an offence against the Act. Under the *Bush Fires Act 1954* (WA), there are instances where the Shire is required or authorised to collect personal information, such as when you apply to join the Volunteer Bushfire Brigade, or apply for a permit to burn.

For other applications relating to Safety and Emergency Management matters the Shire may not be able to process your request if you are unable to provide some or all of the information requested.
