# Captain's Message

As Captain of the Ferguson Bushfire Brigade, I am proud to present our annual report for the 2024/2025 season. This year has been marked by growth, challenges, and achievements that reflect the commitment of our volunteer firefighters.

# **Community Engagement & Membership**

Our brigade has experienced continued growth in membership, strengthening our ability to serve community. This success is attributed mainly to the outstanding efforts of Jane, Rob, and Graeme, who have championed bushfire preparedness initiatives throughout Ferguson and surrounding areas. Their community engagement work has increased our membership and enhanced local awareness of fire safety and prevention measures.

# **Operational Response**

Throughout this season, our brigade has responded to numerous incidents across the region. Our teams have turned out to fires both within the Shire of Dardanup and in neighboring shires, sometimes traveling considerable distances to provide support. This regional service continues to be highly valued by communities throughout the Southwest.

Your dedication as a member, donating your time to protect lives and property, cannot be overstated. Your professionalism in challenging conditions exemplifies the true spirit of our volunteer bushfire service

# **Technological Advancements**

The adoption of new technologies has significantly enhanced our operational capabilities this season. The integration of BART (Bushfire Automated Reporting Technology) and FireMapper software has improved our coordination and effectiveness, particularly during night operations and in difficult terrain. These tools have streamlined our fire fighting processes, allowing for more efficient resource allocation and improved safety for our firefighters.

# **Leadership & Brigade Structure**

Our Lieutenant and Officer structure has proven extremely effective throughout the season, with each Lieutenant taking ownership of key functional areas within the brigade. Rob Webster has been instrumental in pursuing funding opportunities, submitting numerous grant applications with remarkable success. Most recently, his efforts secured funding for an upgrade to our communications systems, including new handheld radios that will significantly enhance our operational capabilities.

Graeme Mitchell has worked diligently to develop a comprehensive training program that meets the Shire's new and more rigorous Workplace Health and Safety requirements. This work has been conducted in close collaboration with Ric Stacey, who has represented our brigade at numerous

Brigades Working Group meetings, contributing to developing a training framework that addresses our specific needs while meeting regulatory standards.

I am particularly pleased with the continued success of our roster system, which has proven helpful in maintaining operational readiness while respecting the personal commitments of our volunteers. The roster is not designed to be a handbrake on members' lives but rather a tool to ensure everyone gets an opportunity to participate, maintain their skills, and share the responsibility of brigade duties. This approach has resulted in more consistent attendance at training sessions, improved skills retention, and reduced the burden on any single individual.

# Challenges

This season has presented unique challenges, most notably increased suspicious fire activity within our area. The recent spate of deliberately lit fires, including those we responded to last night, has put additional pressure on our resources and volunteers. As members of the community, I'd encourage you to report any suspicious actions you see, particularly while travelling in the evenings at the moment.

# **Infrastructure Development**

I am pleased to report some progress in our infrastructure improvement plans. Lyndon has worked extensively with the Shire of Dardanup to secure grant funding for the extension of our fire shed. This funding has now been approved, with construction expected to commence before the end of this financial year. This expansion will improve our operational capacity and provide improved facilities for training and equipment maintenance.

# **Special Recognition**

I want to extend a special vote of thanks to Ric Stacey, who has served and led this brigade for many years in various capacities including Captain, Fire Control Officer, and most recently as Training Officer. As Ric steps down from his official duties, we acknowledge his enormous contributions to the Ferguson Bushfire Brigade. His leadership, expertise, and dedication have shaped our brigade and left a lasting legacy that has, in many ways, shaped the culture we enjoy today. We are all deeply grateful for his service and commitment to our community's safety.

#### 5.3. Treasurer Report

David presented on behalf of Geoff (Treasurer). Refer to attached report. Of note was Grant's generous donation of the FCO funds from the Shire (\$500) to the brigade. The Brigade does have funds available for improvements and Members are encouraged to consider what items are need (e.g., upgrade of lights within the station, new/reliable handheld UHF, etc.).

# 5.4. Training Officers Report Dave presented. Refer to attached report.

#### 5.5. Equipment Officers Report

Rod Bailey presented. Refer to attached report. It was also noted that PPE ordered in Sep/Oct using the old QR codes were not processed and should be re-ordered. The Brigade won't know until June/July whether its request for low bay lights has been approved. Thanks to those that turned-out and help during the busy bee, which was a success.

#### 5.6. FCO Report

Grant presented - nothing more to report re Brigade business. Grant went on to: Welcome Chris Hynes to the UF AGM. Wish Happy Birthday to Allison. Reiterate that we had a quiet year (incident wise) but going forward an increase in participation as well as attendance at training is necessary.

#### 6. General Business

- 6.1. Member Turn-out/Availability The Captain stressed this season's challenge in obtaining sufficient members to turn-out to incidents. Something must change as this is not sustainable. While it is appreciated that many of the fires are away from our immediate locality, members are strongly encouraged to make themselves available. Further consideration will be given to this issue by the Brigade leadership.
- 6.2. Fuel Card will be distributed based on member's level of involvement as per last AGM agreed position. Ryan will review participation and assign fuel accordingly.

#### 6.3. Other

- i) Permits and Restricted Burning Ongoing until further notice. Ground conditions still very dry.
- ii) Request received from Richard Benny to burn his back paddock. Grant advised Richard is willing to contribute to the Brigade to get the job done. Members were supportive provided ground conditions and weather is right. Grant to liaise and initiate arrangements.
- iii) Spring into Action in 2025 will be called 'Branch Out'. Chris encouraged members to get involved and support this activity. He advised activities are not targeted at those who know everything as it is aimed to be a fun day to encourage member collaboration and familiarity. The Ferguson Brigade will coordinate, supported by Kaitlin Southgate and Chris Hynes.

- iv) QR Codes. Members advised to use the new QR codes. Also, to be sure to provide the log number in the Log Book for truck maintenance items.
- v) The Old Bedford Chris advised it is down in Bridgetown and he is trying to obtain photos. The team there are currently working on preparing it for display in the Volunteer BFB Museum.
- vi) Communications BART Members encouraged to continue to monitor and acknowledge messages. Members noted that there was a lack of audible alert during a recent incident in the middle of the night, which was unusual. It was suggested that a software update on i-phones may explain the lack of notification/alarm on the BART system. The need for members to respond to the BART system was reiterated. Ryan stressed that it's okay to press RED as this lets him know that notifications are being receiving. Ryan will endeavour to copy and paste notifications to the WhatsApp group.
- vii) Max Kerr did not receive notification of the AGM, which was distributed via email. He stressed his disappointment for not having been on the distribution list. An apology for the unintended oversight was provided.

# Upper Ferguson BFB 2024 AGM Officer Reports

#### Captain's Report (Ryan Gibbs)

#### 1. Turnouts

- Since the previous AGM there have been 5 x turnouts by 6 x volunteers the truck has been out for 20 hours this season.
- None of these incidents was in our Primary Brigade area.
- The total person/hours contributed directly attending fire grounds stands at 46.5.
- Many thanks to those who have volunteered time both crewing the truck as well as contributions made in support roles.

#### 2. Crew Capacity

- Finding available crew has been a challenge this season even though it has been quiet. We
  have plenty of competent and skilled people on the register but it has been hard to crew the
  truck when required.
- I question whether we can find a more effective way of having people available for turnouts? Should we consider a roster system as other brigades do?
- I will also put on the record that there is little incentive for people to volunteer their time when
  considering the training burden and compliance requirements placed on the BFB by
  DFES/Shire. I suggest that without incentive we will only see volunteer numbers reduce. It
  won't be good for anyone to have millions of dollars in equipment sitting idle for lack of
  operators to use them.

#### 3. Dardanup Shire/DFES

- We are in a much better position with the Shire with an active and engaged EMO (Dallas Brennan) while our Dardanup Chief has continued to be easy to deal with.
- Those responsible for our area at DFES (Ricky Southgate) have continued to be excellent to deal with.

#### Other notes;

- Truck attended a school excursion for the Yr11 Bunbury Catholic College Geography students studying Bushfire and mitigation at Wellington Forest with Dave Humphreys.
- We propose to maintain a monthly training night during the off-season and are open to suggestion on when this should be for example a Friday evening with the footy and BBQ as an incentive?
- Fuel Card it was proposed and accepted at the previous AGM that the fuel card be allocated on a pro-rata approach for those attending training and turning out. I will compile a list and inform those eligible in coming weeks.
- Please consider taking an active role on the committee this season.

#### **Secretary's Report (Helen Humphreys)**

- Nothing substantive to report, that is not covered by the Captain or Officer Bearers.
- Minimal correspondence received; primarily updates and engagement from Shire and DFES.
- The 2025 W-AFAC Conference is a three-day development program targeting volunteers. It commences Tuesday, 26 August through to Friday, 29 August 2025 and held at the Perth Convention and Exhibition Centre. If interested speak with Ryan as there is an opportunity to proposed potential participants from the Dardanup Brigades.
- Old QR codes no longer work. Be sure to use the new QR codes (on notice board).
- Volunteer ID cards supplied to members that have attended training/provided photos. Note, if you do not have one that is current then see David.
- Installation of the Brigade Honour Board is yet to occur (David has committed to action).

#### Treasurer's Report (David Humphreys on behalf of Geoff Gibbs)

- After an arduous process UFBFB finally succeeded in closing its bank account with Wespac and all funds were transferred to Bendigo (17 July 2024).
- Current Bank Account signatories are Ryan Gibbs (Captain), Helen Humphreys (Secretary) and David Humphreys (Training Officer).
- Opening balance as of 12 April 2024 was \$5,922.77
- Current balance as of 11 April 2024 is \$7,778.98
- Total credits received were \$6,045.70
- Key sources of funds since last AGM included:
  - \$500 from G. Ratcliffe (FCO contribution)
  - o \$500 from S. Gibbs for burn-off assistance
  - \$2,200 from Forest Product Commission for Grant to run Plantation Forestry Training
  - \$2,807 from South 32 for Grant to purchase equipment (e.g., Pressure washer, Air hose real, Portable hose reel and hose, Blower).
  - o \$33.70 Containers for Change
- Total Debits (funds spent) was \$4,187.49
- Interest was \$0.
- Fees were \$2. Note, a monthly service fee of \$15 was being charged but this was successfully challenged, and all service fees reimbursed.
- Items that remain to be purchased are:
  - Dashcam and additional whiteboard (2023 Western Power Grant funds)
  - o Residual funds from FPC Grant (\$901), which will likely go towards UHF radios
  - o Brigade polo shirts, caps and hoodies (as discussed and agreed by Brigade Leadership)
- Brigade members should continue to give consideration on how funds should be used.
- Brigade members should continue to look for grant/sponsorship opportunities.

#### **Training Officer's Report (David Humphreys)**

- Joint brigade training with JCB recommenced 27 October 2024. This continued successfully until mid-December. However, after a break over the festive season, it had been a challenge to recommence/gain member participation.
- It has been suggested that training should continue all year but be held once per month on a regular night.
- Training Officers from all Dardanup Brigades held coordination meetings every few months.
   An overarching Lesson Plan for all priority areas were developed. However, the frequency of these meetings has also waned. Without a dedicated Training Coordinator for the whole of Shire this effort is dependent of a select few to keep driving this initiative.
- R. Gibbs and D. Humphreys attend a 3-day SW Region Workplace Trainer Assessor course and are now certified to deliver the foundation training (Bushfire Safety Awareness and Firefighting Skills).
- 2025 South West Region Training Calendar (current as of 2 April) has been released (displayed on Notice Board). Members should review this Calendar and book ASAP any additional training necessary. See Training Officer for assistance with booking courses/navigating eAcademy.
- In addition to Brigade member training, the successful Dardanup BFB Cadets program continued. Again, ~11 cadets from across Dardanup participated for in a 12-session program. The 2025 Cadet program recommences end of April 2025, at Dardy Central. Please encourage any new potential 'future' brigade members to get involved.

#### **Equipment Officer's Report (Rodney Bailey)**

- Appliance was serviced at start of fire season with no major issues.
- The only problem the truck had was a split foam induction line, which will be fixed when fire season winds down.
- PPE orders seem to be filled. Any outstanding PPE will need to be followed up. Also, any damaged or old PPE will need to be replaced asap.
- Rubbish bins seem to be working as well as the recycling thanks to Dave.
- The rodent blocks and bait boxes seem to be working (spare baits are under the laundry sink). Need to check that the Station is now being included in the Shire pest management program and being carried out.
- Thanks to all who helped with the busy bee on the 27/11/24 weekend.

Thanks to everyone who have given up there time to go out to the call outs. Also a big thank you to Finn for another outstanding year as our Brigade Trainer. Thanks to Matt, who has continued on his great work with the cash for cans programme which helps finance nights like these with drinks and food, cheers Matt. Along with Fire Call outs, Central has been active in the community attending the Bull and Barrel, visits to Dardanup Primary for the colour fun run and info sessions with the kids. Also a big thanks to members who are helping with the

cadets programme at Dardanup Central along with other Brigade members. Also a big welcome and thanks to all the new members who have had their first year with us. and lastly a special thanks to my lovely wife Kate for supporting me over the years.

**Training officer report**: Firstly, I'd like to thank all present members and families for attending this year's Dardanup Central Bush Fire Brigade AGM. I appreciate everyone's efforts this year, from responding to emergency incidents not only in our own fire district, but also to assist neighbouring shires. I'd also like to extend my gratitude to the Brigade Leadership and Executive Group, after a lot of early mornings and long (and sometimes sleepless) nights, we made it through another season.

The 2024 Training Season was ultimately a complete 180° from my last report. The Shire was successful in gaining 6 DFES Trainer – Assessors, endorsed to deliver the Bushfire Safety Awareness and Firefighting Skills courses. The first set of courses were held over 3 days in August, containing 8 of our own recruits, 3 from West Dardanup and a member from Ferguson. Due to this, our members were trained in a timely manner in their own shire, with nearly all attending an incident. We also had volunteers complete courses such as Ground Controller, Plantation Firefighting, Advanced Bushfire and Crew Leader to name a few.

For our brigade trainings, we adopted a "back-to-basics" approach by completing simple yet important firefighting tasks. Topics covered included radios and communications, RUI and asset protection, drafting and pump operations, bushfire theory and crew protection. Attendance by members remained steady at sessions, but we do wish to see some old and familiar faces come down and get back into it. We also held sessions with our neighbours in West Dardanup, with feedback from both brigades being nothing but positive. We have also been invited to train with Burekup more often this coming season, reinforcing the idea that we would like to train with each shire brigade at least once per calendar year. This is important for us to work towards building long-lasting relationships with other brigades and learning new skills off eachother.

Not everything went to plan either, with courses getting cancelled and numerous issues with shire inductions. A Bush Fire Control Officer (BFCO) is appointed by Council, upon recommendation by the Bush Fire Brigade and Chief Bush Fire Control Officer, under the Act.

With completion of the relevant training the Bush Fire Control Officer is to –

- Preside over all Brigade meetings and ensure meeting procedures are followed at all times. (In the absence of the BFCO, the Captain is to preside over the meeting. In the absence of both the meeting may elect another person to preside at the meeting).
- Provide leadership and direction to the Captain, Lieutenants, other Committee members and fire fighters to implement the objectives of the Brigade.
- Act as spokesperson for the Brigade, specifically at the Bush Fire Advisory Committee (BFAC), and generally on public relations and other matters, in conjunction with the Shire of Dardanup.
- Issue permits to burn as authorised under the Act within their area of the district.
- Inspect and report on fire hazards within their district and in the Shire of Dardanup.
- Carry out any duties prescribed under the Act and so authorised by the Shire of Dardanup.
- Take overall charge of fire suppression activities, and/or ensures the principles of the Incident Management System are being adhered to during wildfire suppression or during hazard reduction programs.


