Appendix A Bunbury Community Radio

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Bunbury Community Radio's objectives are to use radio broadcasting to promote and support the broad range of community groups, organisations, businesses and sporting clubs across the greater Bunbury Region including the Shire of Dardanup.

Community groups, sporting groups, not for profit organisations and industry groups in the Dardanup Shire including the Shire itself are already using the station's facilities to broadcast and share information about their events, businesses or groups. Some of these are broadcast as free community announcements twice per hour while others may be using our very affordable sponsorship announcements. The station is an alternative and affordable media outlet for both new and established industries, businesses and tourist operators in the Shire of Dardanup. Through this project the station plans to expand its exposure to the community especially through the provision of outside broadcasts

Having outside broadcasting equipment means that we can promote community and local industry directly. This includes local musicians, literary artists, disability groups, not for profit organisations, the Indigenous community, multicultural groups, tourist attractions, major events and more. As well as promoting local events, activities, achievements, tourism, key locations and the region in general helping to achieve the key objectives of the Shire of Dardanup's grant priority of supporting local community groups and organisation including

- Not for profit organisations and community sector having access to free broadcasting opportunities to promote their services.
- Providing the opportunity for growth in community enterprises, local industry and tourism that generates prosperity and employment through access to more affordable radio advertising.

The second phase of the project is to expand the station's facilities to include a second studio and relocate our control room equipment. With an increasing number of live broadcasts from local presenters on the station, a second studio will allow for the training of new local volunteer radio presenters, students at Dalyellup College and the completion of on-air production work. We have a number of members with learning difficulties with a need for longer training periods in the existing studio. We are broadcasting live programmes for 51-hours a week; and is continuing to increase as more presenters become trained and on-air. With the ability to train more presenters, (we have a number currently in training) we aim to have up to 8-hours of live local programme on air each day. This additional use of Studio 1 will make training and the creation of production work impossible. This second studio will also become a backup studio should there be any problems with Studio 1.

The relocation of the Control Rack to its original planned location will free up the room where it is currently located. This room is intended for inductions and training (all new volunteers undergo an induction as a general volunteer, with a further induction for broadcasters). It will also free up the room for meetings by our Board and sub committees, and make it available for other community groups to use the meeting facilities.

Appendix B Bunbury Community Radio

In its first 2 years of operation, Bunbury Community Radio (BCR) has clearly demonstrated it has filled a niche in the needs of the Greater Bunbury Community. BCR has a healthy membership base; has trained a number of community members as broadcasters and provided the opportunity for their programmes to be on air; is currently training more broadcasters; is broadcasting live programmes for 51-hours a week and is increasing as more presenters are trained. With the ability to train more presenters, we aim to have up to 8-hours of live local programme on air each day.

Dalyellup College, in partnership with Bunbury Community Radio, will be able to access more training opportunities through the use of the additional studio and having more school staff trained to work with the students. (The station is located at Dalyellup College). This will then expand to students from other schools including students living in the Dardanup Shire.

The station is now providing a wide range of groups and not for profit organisations with free and low cost promotional opportunities that previously were not available. These groups supported the establishment of a community radio station that is now able to provide an avenue for them to promote their organisations, major events, activities and programmes improving the delivery and awareness of their services. BCR is a dedicated community radio station providing greater access by broadcasting information about these services and providing more opportunities than were available in the past. This planned expansion of the facilities will enable the station to increase the exposure of community groups and the listening base of the station even further.

Having outside broadcasting equipment means that we can promote community and local industry directly. This includes local musicians, literary artists, disability groups, not for profit organisations, the Indigenous community, multicultural groups, tourist attractions, major events and more. Programmes will be able to be broadcast directly from an event or business as a live and local broadcast. This will bring even more attention to both these groups and the station itself and potentially increasing the number of listeners and our sponsorship base.

This will also help to promote local community events and industries increasing the number of visitors to these events or industries.

Appendix C Bunbury Community Radio

Bunbury Community Radio is providing a community owned and operated quality broadcast facility that is providing radio exposure, support and promotion to assist regional communities and industries to prosper through increased employment opportunities, business and industry development opportunities, and improved local services.

Through its broadcast capacity over the Greater Bunbury region, BCR is able to promote and support key areas of the South West Region:

- Enhance capability of not for profit and community sector to deliver community services.
- Over 100 sporting clubs and up to 300 community groups and not for profit organisations have access to free promotion of their events and organisations.
- Promotion and support of new and future organisations and sporting groups helping them to become established in the region.
- Local interest groups provide material for broadcast segments. These include Indigenous groups, local musicians, multicultural groups, sporting groups and many more.
- Promote and support the creation of new interest groups helping them to build membership, participation and community awareness.

Ensure volunteerism remains a vital part of South West life.

- BCR is operated by almost 50 volunteers and continues to encourage new membership.
- BCR promotes and supports volunteer groups and organisations in the region including the key sectors of health, emergency management and age care, helping to maintain and increase their membership for future sustainability.
- BCR, by training students who are involved in media studies, also introduces them to the concept of volunteering.
- BCR promotes volunteerism so that it is recognised, valued and respected within the region.

Provide opportunity for growth in community enterprises, local industry and tourism that generates prosperity and employment.

- BCR promotes major tourism events, activities and locations.
- Will provide promotion of any "Buy Local" scheme and future SW Regional Blue Print priorities and goals.
- Will provide promotion of the SW Region. "A region of first choice".
- Will provide promotion of local community enterprises, industry and employment opportunities especially those that are new or trying to establish themselves in the region.
- Will provide promotion and support to the development of investment markets and events promoting South West Aboriginal art.
- BCR will help to promote and support the South West as a significant growth area in film, digital media, music and other creative areas.

Achieving a region of excellence in education, health, local government and other agencies.

 Key agencies, such as schools, local government and health have capacity to promote details about their programs, successes, achievements and future planning on the station.

Ensure the region has the capacity to deal with natural events including storm, fire and flood.

- BCR promotes volunteer emergency services groups and organisations especially in the recruitment of new members.
- BCR will broadcast regular and up-to-date information, alerts and warnings during emergency events such as the January bushfires.
- BCR can provide an avenue for police and other emergency agencies to broadcast specific messages, public requests, warnings and other relevant information as needed.

BCR provides opportunities for all sectors of the region to utilise its facilities. Students have the opportunity to be involved in studio production, broadcasting, presenting, script writing and other activities; local businesses are offered affordable rates for sponsorship (advertising) and this is appealing to new businesses starting up with continued growth in the area; people with learning difficulties and disabilities have opportunities to be involved; and BCR offers Grapevine segments to all NFP community groups and sporting bodies to spread news and information relating to their organisations.



- 2. Concrete quote from Coastal Formworks. We will have to provide an extra 4 x labourers and Luke is basically doing this at cost price as a donation to Burekup Cricket Club.
- 3. T and V Fencing Quote for supply and install double cricket net structure. Note this is for two bay x 9 m long sides, 22 m middle section and galv posts only. Also sloped roof is plus \$ 350.00
- 4+5 T and V Fencing supplied drawings.
- 6 Mc Donald Fencing Quote. Note this is for two bay x 21 m sides and middle bay and also includes black powder coated fittings, poles and raked roof net x 9 m long.
- 7 W.A Carpet Supermarket Quote for 9mm cricket pitch x two strips at 22 m x 1.8 m supplied and installed (nets).
- 8 W.A Carpet Supermarket Quote for 9mm cricket pitch supplied and installed (centre wicket). Note we can save \$300 if we remove and prep ourselves concrete.

Nature Playground - 3rd stage

Overview of Project Details (give details of your project)

The school and the school community have asked for a nature based playground for years 1-6 on our oval. A Nature Play Committee was established involving staff members and members of the school community and P&F to design a play space for the students.

The nature playground has been designed around an existing space that has a vast amount of shade from existing established trees.

Materials for the first stages were sourced locally mostly via donations and construction was generally during 'Busy Bees'. The first stages consist of a dry creek bed with river stones and bridge, three teepees, climbing logs and ropes, and a large tunnel with 'rocky mountain' and grassy mound.

For safety reasons, soft fall material needed to meet Australian Standards. A local company supplied this pinechip mulch, funded by the P&F.

The next stage of the Nature Play project includes the building of a raised timber fort-like structure around an existing tree, with a climbing cargo net going down one side and timber steps down the other side. This will create a space under the fort for play, as well as the raised play space.

As this is a specialised structure, it is not anticipated that it be completed by volunteers, therefore we are seeking external assistance to construct the structure. In addition, a timber deck is needed to complete the top of the tunnel area. Soft fall pinechip mulch will be required under the structure for safety reasons.

If this project is expected to extend over several years? Please explain why, and what is the expected end date?

It is anticipated that over the next few years the school P & F will raise funds to support this ongoing development of a nature space for our students.

Implementation of the proposed works to be staged as resources permit.

A suggested timeframe: 1st stage- dry creek/teepee zone; 2nd stage- tyre challenge, tunnel and mound and natural log area; 3nd stage- fort structure and deck on top of tunnel.

If successful in obtaining a Community Grant, an acquittal will be completed as required.

Stages 1-2 are complete, we are now investigating Stage 3.

What benefits to the Shire of Dardanup Community will your project offer?

Our playground will be accessible on our school oval. Approximately 221 students attend from all towns situated within the Shire of Dardanup.

The Church is located to the south of this playground and the Church community may access this playground after weekly Mass during morning tea.

During after school training sessions, siblings of sporting participants access the playground with the supervision of their parents.

What are the objectives and expected benefits of your project?

Researchers at the University of WA have found that natural playgrounds allow children the opportunity to develop their gross motor skills than typical pre-formed playgrounds.

Nature playgrounds have been associated with a variety of health benefits such as improved cognitive function, increased creativity and reduced rates of aggression.

Some of the key benefits:

Children who spend more time outside tend to be more physically active and less likely to be overweight.

Children who play in natural settings are more resistant to stress; have lower incidence of behavioural disorders, anxiety and depression; and have a higher measure of self-worth.

Children who play in natural settings play in more diverse, imaginative and creative ways and show improved language and collaboration skills. Single use, repetitive play equipment becomes boring quickly.

Natural, irregular and challenging spaces help kids learn to recognise, assess and negotiate risk and build confidence and competence

Bullying behaviour is greatly reduced where children have access to diverse nature-based play environments

Any other details or supporting information?

Our P & F have already contributed \$6000 to the cost of this project, along with many hours of labour during Busy Bees and other working parties. There is an additional \$5000 committed to the next stage of the project. This will be reviewed and budgeted for over the next few years.






