Roadwise Update - Jacqui Sharp

- WALGA RoadWise Regional Road Safety Advisor Report to be provided with notes.
- As at 13th of July total of 91 road fatalities have occurred this year in WA– Total of 21 South West fatalities (as at 9 July 2021).
- Road safety grants are now open.
- New drink driving and drug penalties have been in place since the 1st of July 2021.
- Free webinars available about improving road safety knowledge that are relevant to Local Governments.
- Roadwise child car restraint course is now accessible online via the Roadwise Website.

'RYDE Program' and 'End to End Program' Presentation - Ian Anstee

- Investing in Our Youth now 22 years old run various initiatives across the region including 'Paint the Town Red' and driving programs such as 'Regional Youth Driver Education Program', 'Ride Program' and 'End to End Driver Program'.
- 'Ride Program' For youth that may not have any one to sit in the car with them when completing their 50 hour compulsory log book or don't have a car to practise driving in – costs \$15 per hour. Volunteers sit in the car with youth and log their hours – operational from Bunbury South West Sports Centre and in Busselton as well (will soon be available in Collie). Most of the cars used for the program have been donated by community groups. Insurance and fuel is covered by the \$15 dollar cost.
- 'End to End Driver Program' Operating from Withers Program there to pay for every element of the driving process for youth that have no license in place.
 - Program starts with 'Keys for Life'.
 - Decreases amount of youth in the Justice System.
 - Pass rate is significantly higher than state average.
 - 2 Program Officers run the program and multiple volunteers assist including volunteers from WA Police (Community Approach).
 - 18 participants have completed the program and are now all employed.
- Will expand both programs when the opportunity presents itself.
- Cr. P Robinson How can the Shire help this group?
 - 1. The Shire of Dardanup could assist Investing in Our Youth by helping to establish the 'Ride Program' within the Shire of Dardanup.
 - 2. Seek funding or supply cars for the program.
 - 3. Staff from the Shire of Dardanup could potentially help find volunteers/ manage volunteers.
 - 4. Use the Shire of Dardanup Social Media Platforms to seek volunteers and promote both programs.

Action: Group to research grants/ funding opportunities for youth programs in the community.
