INTRODUCTION

PURPOSE AND PROCESS

Distinctly Eaton

Eaton is a modern and active community. It is ready to embrace the growth and creative innovation that will support sustainable outcomes and complement its natural riverine heritage. The focus for the future of Eaton is to continue its growth as a commercial hub, meeting the needs of the regional community in harmony with its rich natural assets. This Place Plan will ensure that all future improvements are enduring and reflect the distinct character of Eaton; telling compelling stories of, and contributing to, the sense of place.

This Place Plan and Masterplan covers north-west and central Eaton from Eaton foreshore to the Civic Centre Precinct and Eaton Drive. Place Plans may be developed for other precincts within Eaton in the future.

Big picture thinking

This Place Plan is designed as an overarching strategy for the Eaton locality with a focus on the Eaton Civic Centre and Eaton Foreshore as distinctive character precincts. A place-based approach for Eaton will support the community on its pathway to achieving its unique goals and visions.

Place Plans are collaborative, considered and iterative. In the aim of mitigating ad hoc development, the process towards creating such concise and cohesive summaries is complex. However in short, it journeys through research including literature review, identification, development - and eventual implementation and management by the Shire of Dardanup. Application of current best practice and consultation with key community stakeholders included the Gnaala Karla Booja Native Title Claim Group and the Eaton Advisory Group among many others.

This assisted with identifying the unique qualities of Eaton and refined the community's priorities for the area.

This document captures qualities of the local social, cultural, and physical character that defines Eaton's unique sense of place. The document characterises and frames future staged development, improvements, investments, actions, initiatives and activation. It provides a prioritised framework that will support neighbourhoods and communities in their enjoyment of increased quality of life, an active and healthy lifestyle, and their ability to age in place.

It is a living document designed to evolve to reflect changing community needs. As such, it should be reviewed and updated periodically with the community.

The delivery of initiatives may be short to medium term or up to 20 years. This is a long term plan to upgrade and revitalise Eaton.

Sub-precinct Plans. This section and its plan is a further level drill-down and geographically locates the three Sub-precincts. The section analyses their local context and character, and explores gaps and opportunities at this scale.

Activation Strategy. This section outlines a schedule of actions, projects and programming based on identified opportunities that have arisen as activation ideas throughout the process.

Implementation Framework. This section is a summary table of the opportunities identified in the previous sections to assist the Shire in planning the implementation of the initiatives. It should be printed at A3.

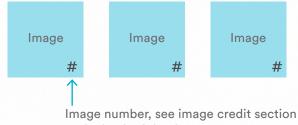

PERMEABLE WETLANDS – an open and breathable place that sustains and respects natural heritage assets, with blue and green fingers that thread and flow to the river. A place deeply connected to Country.



CONNECTED COMMUNITY – built on connections and interrelationships between urban centres and natural habitat. A well-served and welcoming regional centre to live, work, shop and relax.



VIBRANT AND ACTIVE LIFESTYLE – an oasis of healthy recreation and outdoor activation.

- Services Local Government and Utilities (support walkability and connectivity for a pedestrian and cycle friendly town).

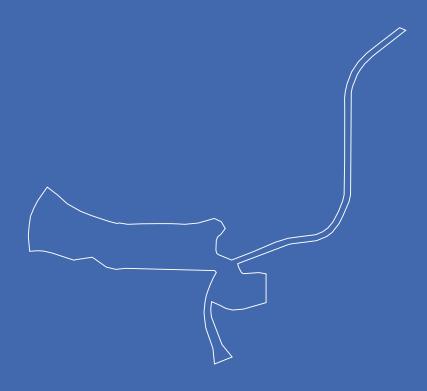

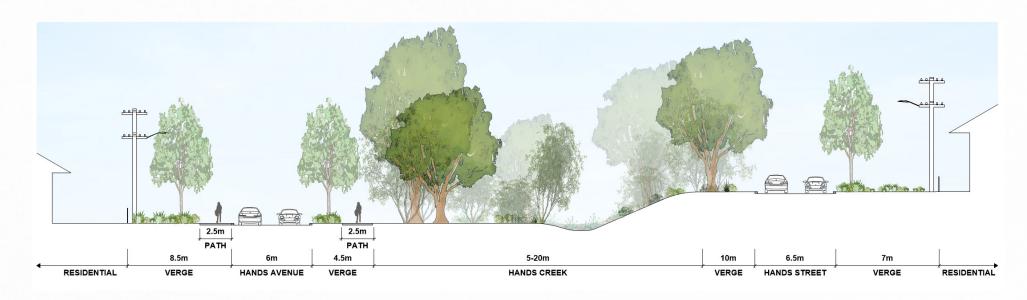




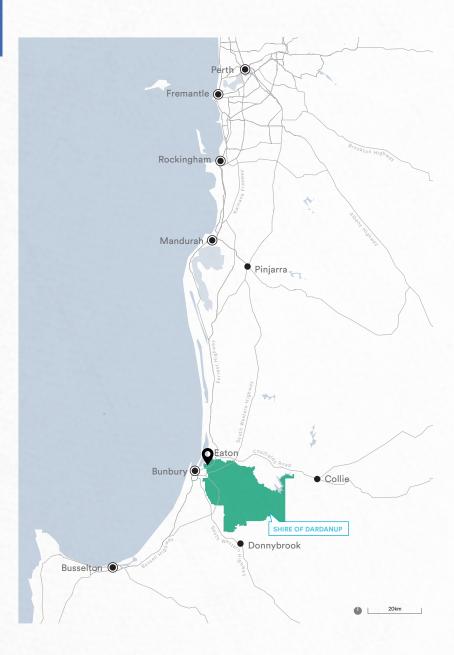

Eaton Context and Character

Eaton is a well-rounded river town with so much to offer.

Context

Eaton is a town within the Shire of Dardanup in Western Australia, approximately 165km or just under 2 hours drive south of Perth, and just 7km north-east of Bunbury. It is one of the largest towns within the Shire, constituting 80% of the Shire's population.

Nearby neighbourhoods are Millbridge, Parkridge Estate, Treendale, Australind, Picton, Waterloo, and Pelican Point.

Eaton is a place to escape the cities to breathe fresh-air and connect to Country – land and water – yet still enjoy an increasingly modern world. It is home to a contained, connected, and vibrant community that supports all ages and abilities.

Eaton boasts a number of "getaways on its doorstep," including Ferguson Valley, part of the broader Geographe wine region possessing many boutique family-owned wineries and craft breweries where tasty food might include marron caught in the upper rivers.

Between river and road

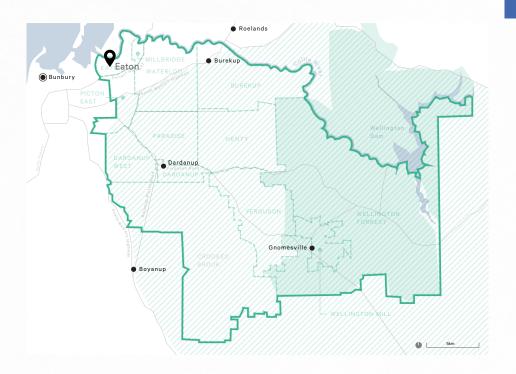
The town's ribbon of residential development is contained by the Collie River to the north, Old Coast Road to the west and Forrest Highway to the south and east. These flowing routes define Eaton: the ancient natural beauty of the sandy river foreshore used for recreation and leisure, and the high-speed highway connecting to a faster pace of life.

The proximity to Bunbury and Perth is increasingly felt as urban centres like Eaton expand to meet growing residential and commercial demand. Eaton's popularity is inextricably linked to its proximity not just to the cities, but to its blue and green surrounds and casual holiday feel.

The focus for the future of Eaton is to continue its growth as a commercial hub, meeting the needs of the regional community in harmony with its rich natural assets. The popular shopping landmark, Eaton Fair, is set to increase in size alongside a new civic precinct and recently upgraded recreation hub.

Deeply connected to Country

Eaton sits within Noongar Boodja (Country), near the meeting point of a number of language groups: Wardandi, Wilman, Kaneang, and Pindjarup.

Spiritual connection to country is strongly linked to the Collie River. Creation stories speak of the Wargal "hairy faced serpent" flowing from the north of Collie, towards Eaton forming the Collie River. It wound its way near Burekup then, when it reached Eaton, turned its body away from the salty water creating the estuary, and travelled back inland.¹ The name "Maardalup" may have been the original name for the area meaning "meeting of three rivers". Indigenous people would have spent the winter in the hills, looking high over the land before travelling through the warmer seasons to the coast and Eaton for food.

Koorliny Beelya 'water going along'

The Collie River Heritage Trail along the Eaton Foreshore promotes the cultural identity and history of the Pindjarup, Wilman and Wadandi people. Elder Joe Northover reflects on the unique and spiritual relationship the local Aboriginal people have with the Boodjar (land) and Beelya (river). https://www.dardanup.wa.gov.au/our-shire/tourism/collie-river-heritage-walkway/

Farming, fishing and shopping

The earliest built heritage in Eaton is Hough Homestead. The Hough family farmed the land for 152 years from 1840. The family's significance to the area is remembered by a 150 year old memorial Marri tree and plaque in Gromark Park near Parkridge Estate (also known as Glen Huon Tree on the municipal inventory).

Early urban development

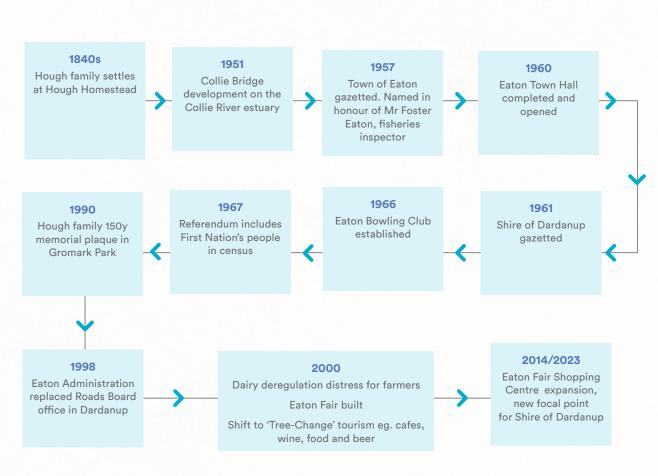
Urban development at Collie River estuary commenced in 1951, first referred to as 'Collie Bridge' with houses in the 'Collie River Estate'. The name was changed to 'Eaton' in recognition of work done in the area by fisheries inspector, Mr Foster Eaton. Eaton is thought of by many as an old fishing town. In less than a decade Eaton had become a well-established community, formally recognised as a townsite in 1957 served by a Town Hall in 1960 and the Bowling Club in 1966.

The rise of a regional destination

Eaton continued to grow, as families were drawn to its riverside lifestyle and proximity to Bunbury. In the 1980s the Australind bypass further improved connections to Perth and fuelled more residential and commercial interest in Eaton. In 1998 the Shire's Administration Centre moved from Dardanup to Eaton recognising Eaton as the Shire's principal urban centre. The opening of retail mecca Eaton Fair Shopping Centre in the new millennium and subsequent expansion have put Eaton firmly on the map as a regional destination.

Context palette



Character

Built form

Primarily detached, single storey from the late 1900s, generally brick and render and in reasonable condition. Lots are medium sized and are front loaded with double formal driveways. There is little built heritage. Commercial structures include Eaton Fair an inward looking retail centre presenting blank façades to the street that are articulated by applied colour horizontal and chequered panels.

Public realm

Typical scale and topography of a small town of its time. It has been designed around the car, with an organic layout of crescents and cul-de-sacs with some traffic calming. Principal roads form the spine of the town with minor residential roads extending to the foreshore and within the limits of Forrest Highway. Streets are utilitarian: verges are wide, front fences exist, yet front gardens are neat and open. Considerable active and passive public open space (POS), from open sports ground to wooded reserves and linear trails. There are hard amenity elements including playgrounds, shelters, viewing platforms and jetties. Wayfinding is via road signs. Public art includes urban art project murals on walls and utilities service cabinets, and the Collie River Heritage Walk with bright red interpretation signs.

Environment

Climate: The region is characterised by diverse seasons and micro-climates resulting from the elevated rolling hills, cool sheltered valleys and mild ocean breezes off Geographe Bay.

Temperatures: 15-25°C average.

Rainfall: Mean of ~800mm per year collected over ~80 days.

Soil: Sandy and loamy soils (over deeper clays).

Water: Eaton sits in the Leschenault catchment area. The groundwater is high, high in iron, prone to salinity and thus poor quality and prone to flooding in the river lowlands in winter.

Vegetation: The sandy heathlands and woodlands would have been covered in samphire, reeds, sedges, Banksia, Paperbark, Peppermint where waterbirds thrived. Now new trees include palms, figs, eastern states gums, Jacaranda, Queensland Box Trees, Magnolia etc which have very little ecological value but perform an ornamental function in the landscape. There is good tree retention in the reserves. Soft planting wise, there is a presence of understory groundcovers.

Topography: Low wetland areas rise into dunal features which batter to the river over localised hillocks. Long distance views to the river are obscured by the intermittent ridges and mature woodland along the riverbank. Patterns include curves in the river and streets, powerlines, and dotting of clumped trees.

Landscape assessment

- Eaton's form in function and scale, favours vehicular movement as the preferred mode of transport.
- Pedestrian movement and circulation are more inviting along Eaton foreshore and within recreational areas, not along primary or secondary streets/roads.
- Connections to Eaton foreshore, wetlands and recreational open spaces are weak in terms of wayfinding, with limited provision of shade.
- Eaton Fair Shopping Centre and civic area are Eaton's civic heart, however, they lack public and communal civic areas for the community.
- Limited tree canopy cover is provided by existing street and verge trees.
 This increases micro temperatures and reduces outdoor urban comfort for the community.
- An Urban Forest Plan is not existing and would provide environmental, Ecologically Sustainable Design (ESD), cultural and wayfinding benefits to Eaton.
- Signage and wayfinding is limited and not coordinated by way of a signage strategy.
- Water Sensitive Urban Design (WSUD) interventions in practice in some areas, however, evidence of erosion in existing drainage lines that would benefit from restoration and managed stormwater release within catchments.
- There are acknowledged challenges with high iron levels in bore water on plant selection and health as well as discolouration of fixtures, equipment, furniture, and hardscape materials.

Sense of place

Eaton has riverine character

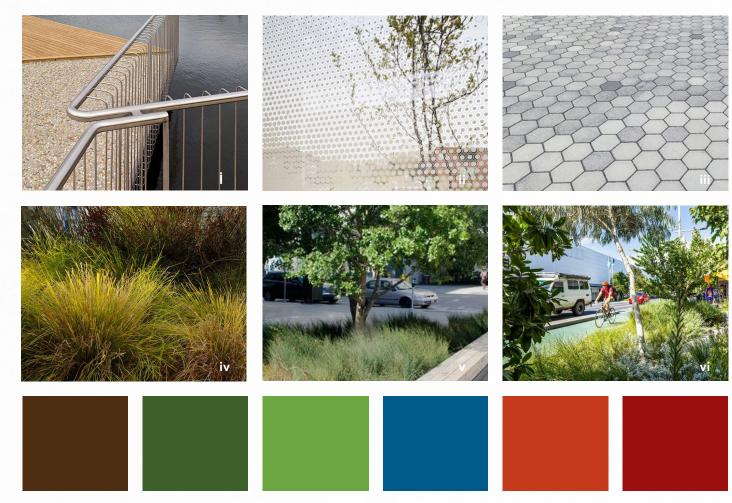
Eaton is a river town boasting wide blue skies, permeable vegetated wetlands, and calm mirror-like water ever-changing throughout the day. Local fauna includes elegant waterbirds and fish.

Eaton's overall character is defined by its blue and green landscape, water and vegetation merging in the waterways and wetlands.

- Glimpses through leafy
 Melaleuca tea trees of the quiet
 serpentine river as it winds west
 to the estuary.
- Finger-like reeds and exposed tree roots perforate the edge of the wetlands and river bank.
- Fractal patterning of bubbles on the water surface.
- Active sportspersons spill from one facility to another, enjoying the abounding nature on their doorstep.

The place palette should be considered in the general urban design of the place, e.g. landscaping, footpaths, amenities and public art, etc.

Theme - Permeable Wetlands

The historic natural wetlands and river setting that drew the Traditional Owners to the Collie River foreshore still draw people to live and work in Eaton today. Urban expansion has resulted in weakened connections to nature and put a strain on natural drainage systems. It has also resulted in environmental degradation and threats to local ecological communities, e.g. loss of habitat impacting on populations of endangered Western Ringtail Possums. With urban growth, the visual connection to Eaton foreshore is dependent on the remaining fingers of wetland permeating inland at points like Eagle Wetland Reserve and Hands Creek.

Theme - Connected Community

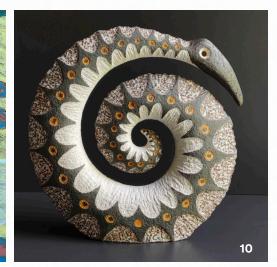
Bounded by the snaking Collie River to the north, Forrest Highway to the south and east, and Old Coast Road to the west - access to Eaton is restricted to just four points: Hamilton Road and Pratt Road to the west off Old Coast Road; Eaton Drive to the south from Forrest Highway, and the northern extent of Eaton Drive connecting across the bridge on the Collie River to Treendale.

The internal street network curves around the natural contours, wetland features and constraints of these external highways, forming discrete pockets of housing e.g. neighbourhoods like Millbridge and aged care facilities like Bethanie Fields, linked by Eaton Drive and Hamilton Road. The car dominant arterial streets encourage driving over public transport, cycling and walking.





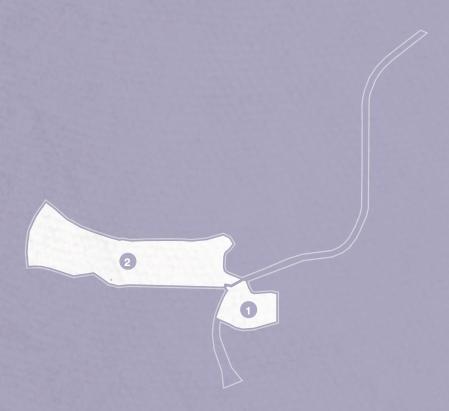

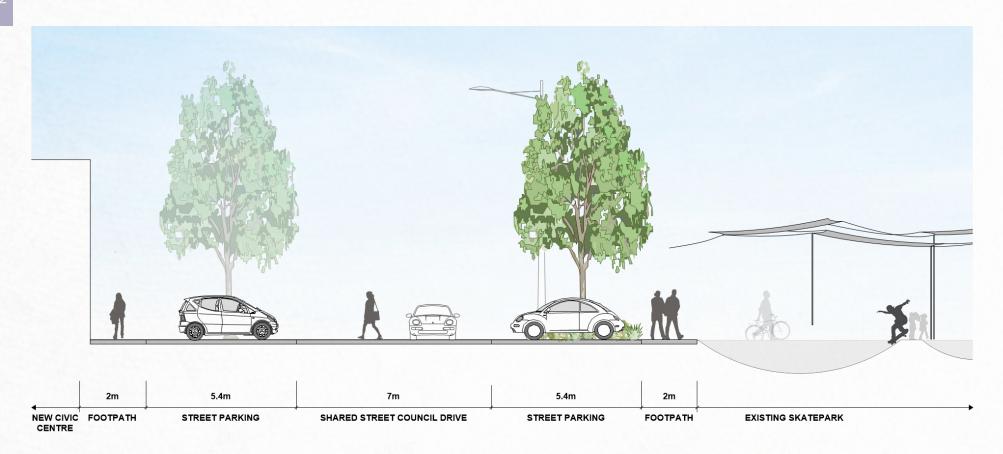

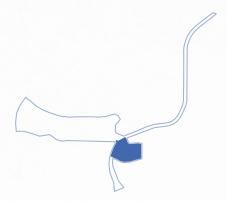


SECTION C - COUNCIL DRIVE LOOKING NORTH

EATON CIVIC CENTRE PRECINCT

Context and Character

Eaton Civic Centre forms the beating heart of Eaton.



Context

Positioned at the junction of arterial Eaton Drive and Hamilton Road, the Civic Centre serves the needs of the local and wider community with a regional shopping centre, eateries, fuel stations, civic administration, Glen Huon Reserve, a playground and skatepark. The precinct will soon be extended with the expansion of Eaton Fair to frame a new town square and provide additional indoor recreation with a multi-screen cinema. Together these elements foster the civic and social connections that define this community.

- Eaton Fair, whilst a crucial economic centre for the Shire, is an inward-facing
 retail centre that turns its back on the surrounding neighbourhood, including
 the wetlands connection along Hands Creek. The planned Eaton Fair expansion,
 relocation of the Shire's administration buildings and realignment of Council
 Drive will open the connection between the green sporting reserve with the blue
 and green landscape of Hands Creek to the north.
- Glen Huon Reserve hosts several local sporting clubs with players of all ages.
 Eaton Recreation Centre and Eaton Community College lie to the east of Glen Huon Reserve supporting this hub as a key node for Eaton's young people.
 The recently upgraded playground and skatepark are popular with families and youth, linking Eaton Recreation Centre to the retail precinct.

- Bethanie Fields and Bethanie Esprit Retirement Village are east of the
 precinct. Providing accessible connections between these older communities
 and the Civic Centre is key to supporting Eaton as an accessible and inclusive
 community. Consider a self-driving bus circuit once this technology becomes
 supported by wider uptake and regulations.
- Hands Creek to the north of the Civic Centre once drained water from the surrounding wetland now Eaton Fair, Glen Huon Reserve, Eaton Community College (ECC), and road reserves. These changes in land-use have increased stormwater discharge into the drainage channel; in high rainfall the channel reaches capacity and overflows into the avenue. The creek is not only essential civic infrastructure, but also a biodiverse asset which provides a green link between Watson Reserve and the wetland at ECC. The northern retail expansion creates some opportunities in the town square and Council Drive to improve conditions.

Character

Built form

The Civic Centre is a place of contrasts – the covered internal streets of Eaton Fair Shopping Centre defended by its high walled servicing areas and perimeter car parks. The north-east sector is a contained residential estate of small lots with low level brick and tile detached houses. The administration centre is soon to be relocated in a new town square building integrated into the Eaton Fair expansion plan, creating a more formal civic façade to Council Drive.

Passive surveillance in this town centre: depends on activation from the Eaton Recreation Centre and opening hours within Eaton Fair.

Public realm

The expanse of open green turf at Glen Huon Reserve is a stark contrast to the enclosed urban forms described above. The open turf bleeds around the sports pavilion, play areas and peripheral roads.

Eaton Drive and Recreation Drive curve around the precinct preventing permeable connections to the surrounding residential communities beyond.

Environment

Minimal natural environment prevails, apart from the green oval and the open skies and the few small trees.

Landscape assessment

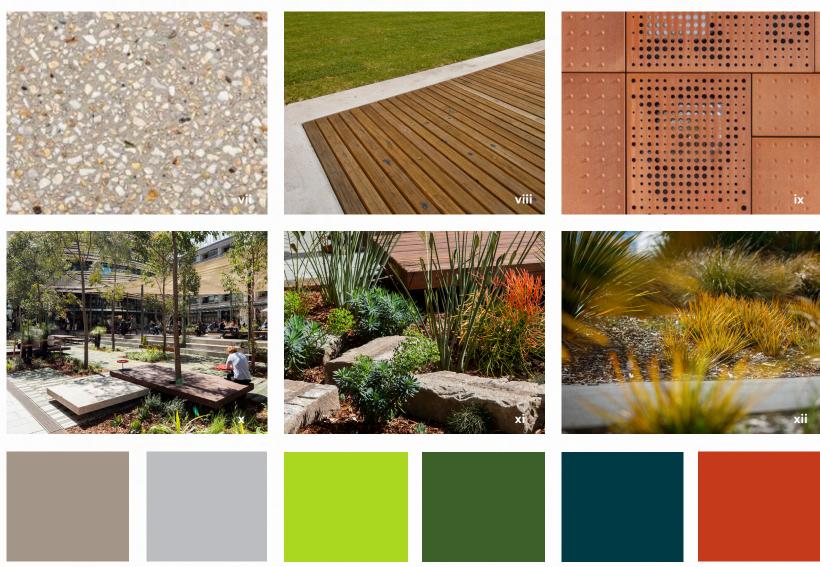
- Car parking areas visually dominate the perimeter of the Civic Precinct.
- Connections between Civic Precinct and Eaton Foreshore are weak; lacking clear wayfinding, including signage, landscaping, pedestrian links and tree corridors.
- Eaton Fair Shopping Centre and civic area are Eaton's civic heart, however, they are semi-private and lack public and communal civic areas for the community to gather outdoors.
- The Civic Centre has a role in water sensitive urban design (WSUD) and stormwater management of local catchment stormwater. Its relationship to the river foreshore, via existing drainage lines is disconnected and is not expressed or acknowledged.
- Limited urban street trees to identify and lead community to Civic Centre node. Tree planting evident around shopping centre, but current planting will not provide significant canopy cover to all carparking areas.

Sense of place

Civic, hard, fine, urban, and retail driven.

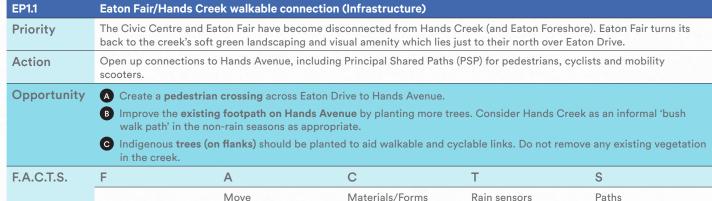

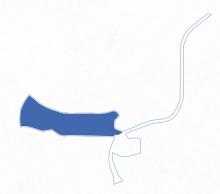


SECTION D - PRATT ROAD LOOKING WEST

EATON FORESHORE PRECINCT

Context and Character

Eaton Foreshore Precinct is an unwinding fringe to the town.



Context

The traditional heart of old Eaton lies here, on Eaton's foreshore of the Collie River. Just as the Traditional Owners would have migrated to Eaton foreshore to meet, hunt fish and share food, the modern community of Eaton gravitate here to share in water sports, enjoy tranquil walks along the river and celebrate their community at Eaton Foreshore Festival. This place is for relaxing, play and parties.

Traditional stories are told in the Heritage Trail, connecting modern community to the ancient country they stand on and look out to across the Collie River.

The ancient wetlands still permeate into this precinct – formally in the recreation oval, the Eagle Wetlands and Hands Creek, informally through natural drainage channels when the rainfall is high.

The original Eaton establishments are still strong. The old town hall (known as Eaton Community Hall or Eaton Hall) still serves its community, now as home to the Bunbury Repertory Club. The Bowling Club is still the life support for the older Eaton community, sharing its river views with the Senior Citizens Association. To the west sits Slater's Corner, named after settlers Percy and Lylia Slater.

The western edge of the precinct serves as the western public face of Eaton; a significant gateway. The original Eaton Shopping Centre at Slater's Corner greets passing travellers on Old Coast Road with rest stop amenity: fuel, pharmacy, bottle-shop and post office, buffering the Riverside caravan park from the busy road. The west entry from Old Coast Rd lacks an entry marker to position it clearly on the tourist trail; a landmark to highlight Eaton as a destination.

Eaton Oval is home to junior and senior football and cricket clubs with the occasional softball practice. Adjacent basketball and tennis courts are now lightly used, more often needed for overflow parking. Together with the adjacent foreshore water activities and playground, this area is a focal point for the young and active Eaton community.

Recreation brings the Eaton community together from huddling around the sidelines in all weather to watch children and partners play football and cricket, to having fun and fundraising at the Eaton Foreshore Festival.

The adjacent precinct plan and following Sub-precinct Plans replace the previous Foreshore Masterplan from 2014.

Eaton Foreshore's three Sub-precincts

- Eaton Reserve Oval and Eaton Hall Sub-precinct
 Indoor and outdoor space for active sports and performance art.
- 2. Eaton Foreshore Reserve Sub-precinct
 Linear recreation area along the Collie River foreshore.
- Eaton Bowling Club and Adjacent Wetlands Sub-precinct
 Includes the Bowling Club facilities, Eagle Wetland Reserve and Duck Pond Wetland Reserve.

Character

Built form

Dwellings are mostly detached with neat and open front gardens. Buildings are mainly low-lying single-storey, with the occasional second-storey positioned to view the river.

Building fabric: Buildings are uniformly brick and render with clay tile or corrugated metal roofs.

Passive surveillance: Verges are wide, lots are medium-sized and front loaded with formalised double driveways. Houses have clear visibility of the streets and public footpaths.

Public realm: The precinct includes expanses of active and passive public open space, along Eaton foreshore and permeating inland through the recreation oval and wetlands. There are hard court elements and playscape including the new Colin Spragg adventure playground. Additional recreational amenity is provided in shelters, viewing platforms, sandy beaches and jetties.

Wayfinding exists along the Collie River Heritage Walk with its trail of bright red interpretation signs, yet in the residential area it is only via road signs.

Environment

The low-lying land of the floodway prevails here with its associated fauna and flora like water birds and tolerant trees. The residential area sits back in the wings of this beautiful stoop.

Sense of place

Sleepy river-carved curves, tufted fringe-life.

Landscape assessment

- The river is a natural asset and a primary destination in Eaton and surrounding area.
- Scattered native trees within wide, relatively flat mown grass areas between Pratt Road and Collie River.
- Large public open space areas evident along foreshore reserve support community gatherings.
- Cultural trail along foreshore edge provides important link. Cultural heritage represented through interpretive information connects community to First Nations culture.
- Walking trail also provides important connection and proximity of the community to the river edge and to enjoy the riverine environment. Some seating areas to dwell evident along Eaton foreshore.
- Upgraded children's playground with more nature-based elements contributes
 to natural setting and character of foreshore reserve. The remaining reserve
 does not have any secondary offerings for families to pause and play.
- Existing trees along river edge, with glimpses of river still possible from Pratt Road.
- Noticeable iron staining on footpaths and fixtures, furniture, and equipment from high concentration in bore water.
- Parking provision to access river edge with watercraft as well as foreshore trail and open spaces.
- Connections to Eaton foreshore, and recreational open spaces are weak in terms of wayfinding. Signage including identifying key entry into Eaton from the west is not defined.
- Bus route and bus stop along section of Pratt Road.
- Water Sensitive Urban Design (WSUD) interventions in practice in some areas is positive. Stormwater and management of high rain events cause flooding in wetter months and reduce use of open grass areas and recreational facilities.

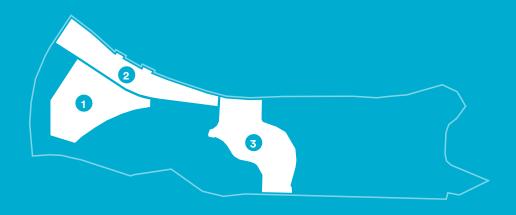

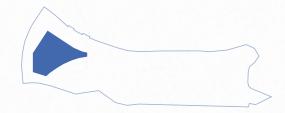




EATON RESERVE OVAL AND EATON HALL SUB-PRECINCT

Context and Character

Eaton Reserve oval is a lively part of town.



Context

This area is centred on recreation and entertainment.

The popular oval runs at capacity through winter and summer, the clubrooms soon to expand to accommodate the growing demand. In peak season the adjacent roadway and old basketball courts are lined with cars as parents watch and wait for their children's matches to end. Families inevitably zigzag across Pratt Road to get between games, cars and Eaton foreshore play area.

Alongside the old basketball courts are community tennis courts, bringing the longstanding Eaton tennis community together.

Drainage here has been a concern, with the site located on a flood plain. Recent landscape improvements have gone some way to addressing localised flooding in periods of high rainfall. The water quality here is poor and high in iron, unifying all local landscape features in a rusty 'Eaton Brown'.

Eaton Hall is still a popular community building now serving the local theatre community. The inherited building is much loved, yet falls short of delivering the quality of amenity modern users would like to experience.

Character

Built form

Eaton Hall built in 1960, simple single storey brick pavilion, retro and stained by the bore water iron.

Public realm

The expanse of green in parts brown, turf on the oval is what prevails here, fringed by darker, muted, water-tolerant trees.

Environment

Defined by its open, raw, natural environment. Expansive grass, mature trees, textured undergrowth and permeating water. Habitat for water birds.

Sense of place

Course grain, generous and unpretentious open space.

Landscape assessment

- Eaton Reserve Oval is a recreational asset for Eaton, however, the high level of iron in the bore water significantly impacts the health of the playing surface and surrounding landscape planting.
- Planting of grasses, sedges and rushes around Eaton Reserve Oval provide an appropriate landscape aesthetic and edge treatment to the field to help manage waterlogging and flooding caused by high rain events, which is another significant constraint impacting how and when the oval can be used.
- Perimeter planting of trees further defines the playing fields.
- Club rooms are heavily stained by bore water which affects the appearance of the facility.
- Parking provided to rear of clubrooms. No tree planting within carpark to cool microclimate in hotter months.
- Lighting provided to oval for evening/night use to extend daytime/nighttime use.
- Cricket nets lie northwest of the oval.
- Basketball courts are degraded and require upgrade or reconsideration of where and what type of outdoor basketball area is suitable given local indoor venue.
- Two tennis courts are in reasonable condition with a third in poor condition.
- The relationship between Eaton Hall and adjacent recreation facilities is at odds with each other. There is no sense of arrival or sequence of how to use the outdoor area, apart from an informal carpark. The space lacks structure and purpose.
- A mown grass area lies to the hall's east, which may be used to provide additional sporting facilities in the future. The hall is representative of its age, has historical value and continues to provide a function for the Eaton community.

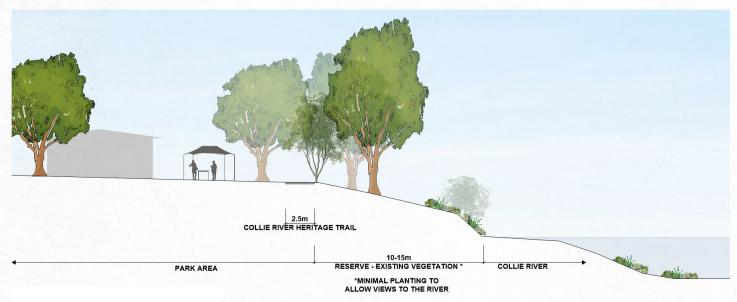

EATON FORESHORE SUB-PRECINCT

Context and Character

Eaton Foreshore Reserve is a pretty, festive part of town.



Context

Recent landscaping works and heritage interpretation trail have elevated the appeal of this treasured reserve for active sports and gentle walks. There is a fine balance here of protecting the natural habitat and supporting the community's desire to enjoy recreation on and by the water.

This area is activated daily, weekly and annually by its playground, water sports and foreshore festival. New public toilets support longer visits to Eaton foreshore, and a regular coffee and refreshment outlet would encourage even more use by all ages.

Growing popularity is putting pressure on both parking and equipment storage. Eaton foreshore area is prone to flooding and erosion. Any alterations to the landscape need to be carried out with careful respect to natural environmental processes, and any erosion protection always needs to be carefully designed to avoid impacts to upstream and downstream sections of banks.

The Eaton Foreshore lies within the Kalgulup Regional Park. The Kalgulup Regional Park Management Plan (KRPMP) should be considered in the design of works and activities within this area.

Character

Built form

There are no buildings on Eaton foreshore.

Public realm

There is Colin Spragg adventure playground with its well-chosen deep colours, shared pathways along the river, the new parking pod of red asphalt for trailers near Eaton Boat Ramp, nearby timber jetties, and its pea gravel beds.

Environment

The low-lying land of the floodway prevails here with its associated fauna and flora including water birds, fish and water-tolerant trees.

Sense of place

Blue and green breathing space where water and vegetation merge, fringed by linear reeds, winding tree roots and dense bush. Glimpses through trees reveal stunning skies and calming mirror like river.

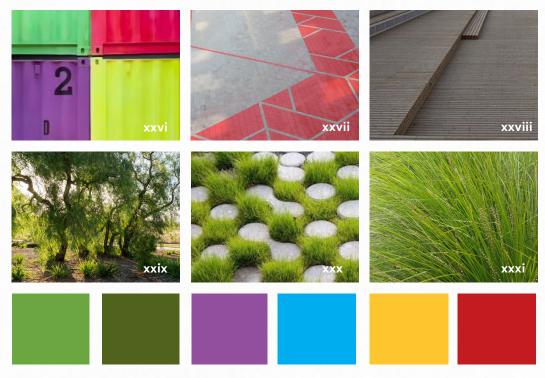
Landscape assessment

- The river is a natural asset and a primary destination in Eaton and surrounding area.
- Scattered native trees within wide, relatively flat mown grass areas between Pratt Road and Collie River.
- Large public open space areas evident along foreshore reserve support community gatherings.
- Precinct includes cultural trail along foreshore edge which provides important link. Cultural heritage represented through interpretive information connects community to First Nations culture.
- Walking trail also provides important connection and proximity of the community to the river edge and to enjoy the riverine environment. Some seating areas to dwell evident along Eaton foreshore.
- Upgraded children's playground with more nature-based elements contributes to natural setting and character of foreshore reserve. The remaining reserve does not have any secondary offerings for families to pause and play.
- Existing trees along river edge, with glimpses of river still possible from Pratt Road.
- Noticeable iron staining on footpaths and fixtures, furniture, and equipment from high concentration in bore water.
- Parking provision to access river edge with watercraft as well as foreshore trail and open spaces.
- Connections to Eaton foreshore, and recreational open spaces are weak in terms of wayfinding. Signage including identifying key entry into Eaton from the west is not defined.
- Bus route and bus stop along section of Pratt Road.

- Water Sensitive Urban Design (WSUD) interventions in practice in some areas is an
 existing positive/win, stormwater and management of high rain events cause flooding
 in wetter months and reduce use of open grass areas and recreational facilities.
- The lower Collie River shows a significant level of erosion along the river bank due to wave action.
- Hands Creek is also suffering from erosion, resulting in environmental degradation, and potentially a public safety hazard.

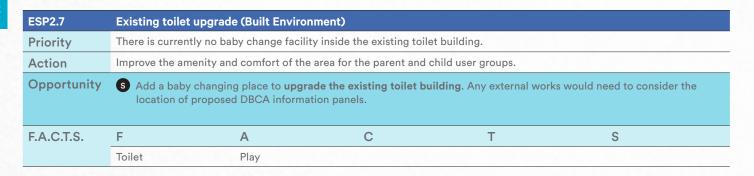

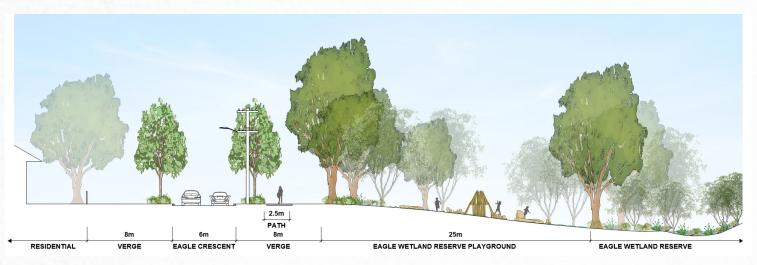

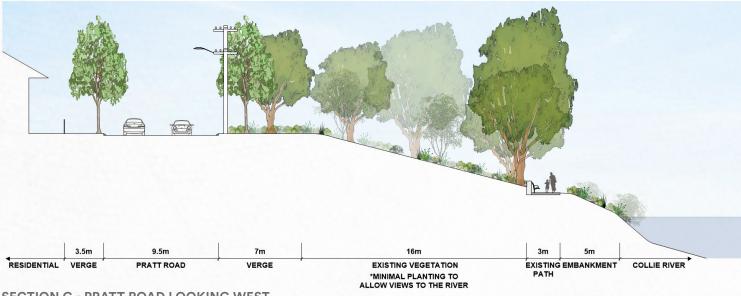

EATON BOWLING CLUB AND ADJACENT WETLANDS SUB-PRECINCT

Context and Character

Eaton Bowling Club and surrounds is a celebratory folks part of town, competitive yet thoughtful.

Context

The popular Eaton Bowling Club sits between the river's edge and Eagle Wetland Reserve. Two of the three greens are in constant use, the third set for improvements to create an inclusive accessible green. The constraints of the natural setting and increasing popularity of the club have put strain on the parking court, now overflowing on to Pratt Road.

The Eagle Wetland Reserve and Duck Pond Wetland Reserve to the south of the Bowling Club are dense ancient wetlands that connect Eaton to its traditional Country. A beautiful amenity, footpaths respectfully bypass these green environmental lungs.

Character

Built form

The brand new Eaton Bowling Club sits proud with its limestone walls, taupe composite timber cladding, timber posts, and pre-painted steel roofing. The other built form is the surrounding residential and occasional civic building like the apricot brick Eaton Baptist Church.

Public realm

Utilitarian simple residential streets, pathways and lawns contrast with the raw natural depths of the river and wetlands.

Environment

Palms and conifers rise optimistically, but bulk comes from woody Marris and softer Melaleucas, the more dense vegetation around the natural areas at the river's edge and the wetlands. Topography is undulating.

Sense of place

The form feels elevated and hilly, a place of prospect with quietly hidden lower-lying wetlands.

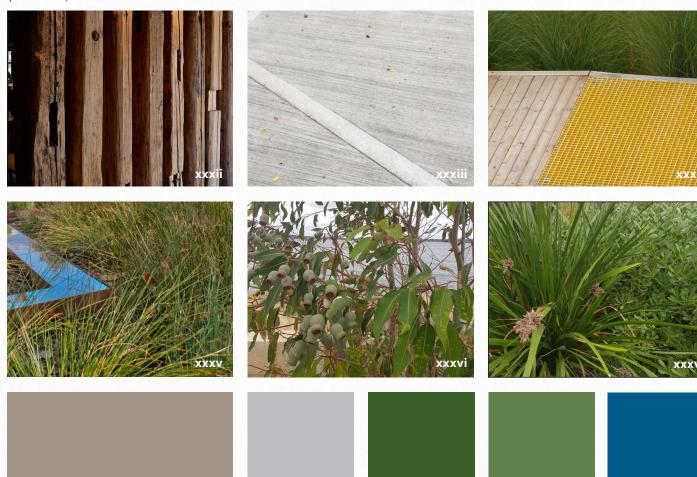
Landscape assessment

- A new bowling club building addresses the river from the southern side of Pratt Road. A pedestrian crossing blister island supports pedestrian crossing to a long semi-sealed, unmarked carpark that exists adjacent on Eaton foreshore reserve side. Layout of carpark could make use confusing and inefficient during peak use times.
- The carpark provides amenity to the bowling club patrons, and people using Eaton foreshore reserve and trail walks.
- An informal footpath link runs along the back of carpark area and is
 identified by white dashed markings. This is not safe. A trail runs at the
 base of the embankment, below this carpark area and provides a greater
 connection to the river and separation from Pratt Road.
- Eagle Wetland is an environmental asset. Addresses Bobin Street as a solid vegetative screen, with dark understories. Dense vegetation. A footpath exists on Bobin Street verge, however there is no street tree corridor linking residents down to the river or up to Hamilton Road.
- More spaced trees on Eagle Crescent side of wetland, which provide some shade to the large verge area. An unsealed access road leads to a secondary car park and storage area. This area is not a desirable view for residents.
 No footpath provision or street trees corridor on Eagle Crescent to connect residents to the river or up to Hamilton Road.

- No relationship existing between the Bowling Club carpark and wetland edge. No tree planting to carpark, which is on the north side of wetland.
- Existing trees along river edge, with glimpses of river still possible from Pratt Road.

Sub-precinct 3 place palette

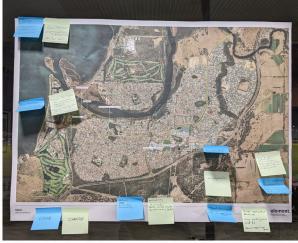

APPENDIX E PLAYGROUND AUDIT

PRELIMINARY - EATON FORESHORE PLAY AUDIT - OVERVIEW

The playground audit is based on visual assessment only as the Shire of Dardanup's Asset register information was not available at time of audit. The audit takes into consideration the following criteria, in relation to each identified play element:

- Condition
- Base life / design life. [Estimated awaiting asset information]
- Estimated renewal year of play asset. [Estimated awaiting asset information]
- General appeal and suitability of each play element and resulting play experience.
- Inclusive play (high level only and a certified audit in relation to inclusive and accessibility would be required)
- · Materiality
- Type of play element, i.e proprietary, bespoke, fixed, structured / unstructured.
- Compatibility with the proposed future Place Plan for Dardanup.

Please note:

- Asset register information was not available at time of audit.
- This is not a safety audit and a safety inspection of the equipment has not been undertaken as part of this audit.
- This audit is separate from the Shire of Dardanup's internal procedures in relation to asset management.
- Where base life has been exceeded, asset has been highlighted orange.

A new play area, including natureplay elements was installed at Eaton Foreshore in 2016.

The primary play area for the Eaton Foreshore has been consolidated into one location, which is supported by a carpark, toilets and shelter with seating.

The play area includes natureplay elements such as timber logs, steppers, limestone boulders and native planting. This character is also further supported by natural materials, such as timber and ropes, being incorporated into the flying fox, climbing, swing

and fort structures. Outdoor musical instruments and all-abilities elements also form part of this space and support inclusive play opportunities for children.

A nature play and adventure type play space works well within the Eaton Foreshore Precinct. It supports a narrative that responds to the river and the open grassed area scattered with shade trees. There is a variety of fixed elements, as well as an arrangement of less structured elements that supports exploration, discovery and imaginative play.

The playground was installed in 2016 as is generally in good condition. Future opportunities exist to expand the play space to the east. Existing mature trees would also provide valuable shade.

It is recommended to continue a nature based narrative and one that responds to local cultural heritage, environment and the unique qualities of place, identified in the Eaton Foreshore Reserve Precinct Plan. Reference should also be made to the material, planting and colour strategy.

The play space is appropriate for junior aged children. Future interventions could include youth appropriate elements such as parkour and agility type activities. The inclusion of more allabilities elements would also be encouraged.
