

Fuel to Go & Play Dardanup Bull and Barrel Festival Celebrates Its 21st

What a weekend, perfect weather and a record crowd who didn't care if it was a little muddy underfoot in places. The Festival Committee has had nothing but compliments, a testament to a very hard working and experienced Committee. Approx 150 people volunteered from the Thursday til Sunday helping the Festival Committee set up, working on Festival activities on Saturday and then cleanup. Some of these people were volunteers who worked on successive days. Just shows you the mammoth task that is the Festival that puts Dardanup on the map, showcases the talents of our young people(2 young novice performers plus 5 piece youth band) on the main stage and the parade of the giant puppets pre the lighting of the bull. How magnificent was that! The puppets told the story of the huge toad who drank the Ferguson River dry and what an ending to that story! 133 young and not so young people recorded attendances at the workshops with puppet artist Karen Hethey for 2 weeks in the holidays leading up to the Festival, all learning new skills and teamwork.

The Festival is also a wonderful fundraising opportunity for our community groups - the P&C, P&F, Dardanup Lions, Dardanup Playgroup and Dardanup Community Choir raised \$13,244.00 which doesn't include the profits from the P&Cs showbag stall. Leschenault Scouts, Bunbury Men of Song, Australind High School band and DAD Realty(raising funds for breast cancer research) raised just over \$6,000.000. So you can see how important the Festival is to our community groups. Accommodation was all booked out and no doubt our local businesses benefited as well. The burning of the bull, the Festival tradition didn't disappoint. Jeff Woodman and John Cartwright thrilled the crowd as we all celebrated the finale of another wonderful Festival. The craftsmanship was admired by everyone and we all thought it seemed a shame to burn the bull doing a handstand on the double decker birthday cake. What a 21st! Huge thankyou to Wespine who donate all the timber used.

A big thankyou to the local residents who made their verges available for parking for our Festival visitors. Limited parking around town is a problem so your efforts don't go unnoticed by the Festival Committee. Well done.

The Noongar season of *Kambarang* continues. It is drying out and starting to heat up!! Make the most of the nice weather, get busy tidying up before it gets too hot and plant out the remainder of

your long season crops. Now is your last chance to plant Pumpkin seeds as most varieties require 100 days to mature for storage in Autumn.

I love the incredible diversity of a Summer vegetable patch and one of the benefits of living in a Mediterranean climate is being able to grow food year round. However, gardening in our climate during summer has a few challenges. By choosing climate suitable varieties we can set our garden up for successful harvests with less stress - think crops from Spain, Italy, Greece, Turkey, Iran, India, Texas, California, Africa... the list is long and exciting!

Tips for Success - Here are my Top 5 for growing a Productive Summer Garden.

<u>Tip # 1</u> If you are limited with space, water or time then focus on crops that you eat often, have a short shelf/fridge lifespan, can be hard to source and/or are expensive to buy. If you have a much

larger garden area be careful to start small and keep it manageable. $\underline{\text{Tip} \# 2}$ Reduce your pest issues and stress by focussing on growing season appropriate crops, not only will they taste better but they are more cost effective to grow.

Tip # 3 Avoid becoming overwhelmed mid summer with careful planning and succession crop plantings. By staggering when you sow seeds or seedlings you will have plants maturing at different times, avoiding gluts and making the best use of your space.

Tip # 4 Get creative! Every size garden can benefit from clever use of vertical spaces, they increase your growing area, add interest and potentially necessary shade to your patch. Best to Erect your support structures before you plant. Consider planting Choko, Sweet potatoes and/or Pumpkins on a trellis, giving you a harvest of greens over summer and long storing tubers / fruit to enjoy in the autumn/

Tip # 5 Consistent watering is the key to healthy plants. Not all crops require the same amount so think about grouping thirsty plants together. Automatic systems are great but so are Tap timers. Keep a few spare parts on hand for your irrigation system, chances are you will blow a tap or clip when the shops aren't open! Happy Summer Gardening

Researching local and family history

As well as the Dardanup Heritage Collective, there are many organizations in nearby towns that focus on the history of Bunbury and surrounding regions.

Among these are Harvey History Online, the Ron Maidment Archive at Capel Library, the Bunbury Historical Society at King's Cottage Museum, the Bunbury Oral History Group and the Bunbury Museum & Heritage Centre. Most have a web presence so just Google the group's name to find the relevant site.

One incredible resource for anyone investigating their own family history is the Australind Family History Society. The volunteers at AFHS have over 100 years experience researching people's ancestors worldwide. At their premises they personally help and teach how to research and keep family records. There are 10 computers for the use of members and visitors with access to Ancestry.com, Find My Past plus thousands of books and microfiche. DNA assistance is also available

The AFHS is located in the Harvey Shire buildings adjacent to the Australind Shopping Centre on the corner of Old Coast Road and Paris Road, Australind.

The Declared Pest Rate – What's this about?

This time of year, many landholders across WA receive an annual invoice from the State

for a Declared Pest Rate (DPR). So, what's the deal with this rate?

Simply put, the Declared Pest Rate helps fund efforts to support the control of declared pests like wild rabbits, foxes, feral pigs, and specific invasive weeds that can wreak havoc on individual private land, neighbouring properties, and the broader community. Pests don't respect boundaries, so managing them requires a coordinated, region-wide approach.

Under the Biosecurity and Agriculture Management Act 2007 (BAM Act), landholders are responsible for controlling declared pests on their land. A declared pest is an animal or plant species that causes unwanted impacts on people, the economy or environment, and has therefore been declared under the BAM Act. Declared pests are either not allowed into WA, or if they have become widespread and established, are subject to control or keeping requirements to minimise impact and spread, as it is often not possible to eradicate these pests. The presence and impact of these pests vary across the State. In response, the State collects a Declared Pest Rate in specific areas, matching the funds dollar-for-dollar. The funds are then directed to local Recognised Biosecurity Groups (RBGs), of which there are fourteen across WA. The funds are allocated specifically to the RBG operating in the area from which they were collected, ensuring that the funding is provided to help support the management of priority declared pests for that specific region.

They provide resources to support private landholders in meeting their legal obligations to manage declared pests, which in our area include rabbits, foxes, feral pigs, blackberry, cape tulip, and cotton bush and a few other specific declared pest weeds. However, in some regions, the funds may be directed primarily, or even solely, toward supporting the management of a single type of declared pest, such as wild dogs, based on the specific biosecurity threats in that area. RBGs don't replace individual landholder responsibilities or the need for contracted services; instead, they provide support and promote the effective management of declared pests across the community. They are also responsible for promoting community-wide awareness of the impact of declared pests and the importance of managing them. This is done through community engagement and education initiatives and by encouraging, coordinating and facilitating communitywide pest management activities across different land tenures. While it's easy to think of the DPR as just another bill, the raised funds contribute to the health of individual properties

and our shared ecosystems, hopefully helping to better ensure that our communities are resilient to the threats posed by invasive pests, helping to safeguard Western Australia's natural and agricultural resources for years to come.

Recognised Biosecurity Groups in the South West - There are three Recognised Biosecurity Group's in the South West, including our local Leschenault Biosecurity Group, to our north, the Peel Harvey Biosecurity Group, and to our south, Blackwood Biosecurity Inc. These groups provide guidance and resources such as pest management equipment loan, site visits and some on-ground support, as well as coordination and facilitation of community wide programs such as annual Rabbit Control Calicivirus RHDV1 K5 Release programs, feral pig control programs and others.





- •The single biggest killer is indecision. Having a bushfire plan will help you take action and avoid making last minute decisions that could prove deadly during a bushfire.
- •To survive a bushfire, you must be prepared to make your own decisions. Do not wait and see or expect a knock at the door.
- •You don't have to live in the bush to be at risk from bushfires. Embers can travel up to 25 kilometres during a bushfire, bringing the fire from the bush to your home.
- •Don't rely on a fire truck to protect your home there are only around 1000 fire vehicles in the entire state of Western Australia, including all vehicles from the Fire and Rescue Service, Volunteer Fire and Rescue Service, Volunteer Fire and Emergency Service and Bushfire Service.

- •During a bushfire, stay up to date at emergency.wa.gov.au, 13 DFES (13 3337),twitter.com/dfes wa, facebook.com/dfeswa or your local ABC Radio.
- •The Bushfire Warning System icons and colours changed in 2021. Visit dfes.wa.gov.au/bushfire/prepare to find out more.
- •The Fire Danger Rating System has changed in September 2022. Talking points are available on the Volunteer Hub.

Four simple steps

•Create your bushfire plan, prepare your property, pack an emergency kit and make sure you understand the Bushfire Warning and Rating Systems.

Bushfire Plans

- •Develop a bushfire plan that outlines what you will do if a bushfire occurs. You can visit mybushfireplan.wa.gov.au or download the My Bushfire Plan app from the App Store or Google Play.
- •During a bushfire it can be difficult to think clearly. Planning ahead will help keep you and your family safe.
- •"We will wait and see" is not a bushfire plan. "We never thought it could reach us here" is not a bushfire plan. Thinking about a plan is not a bushfire plan.
- •Consider what to do if you're not at home, children are at school etc and make sure you have back up plans.
- •Practice your plan regularly with your family, write it down and make sure everyone knows where it is.
- •If your plan is to leave, make sure you leave early. Only stay if you are physically and mentally prepared to defend your

property and you have all the right equipment .Remember to plan for your pets and/or livestock – during a bushfire they will need water, shelter and a safe place to stay.

- Over 90 per cent of Western Australia is bushfire prone.
- You are at risk if you live close to or are surrounded by: o Coastal scrub - these fires can be hot and move fast.
- Suburbs, parks and reserves flames and flying embers can cross roads and impact homes.
- Grasslands fires can start easily and spread quickly.
- Farm and paddocks fires can spread quickly over large areas like paddocks.
- Forrest and bushland fires in these areas can be very intense and extremely difficult for emergency services to reach and extinguish.

Prepare your emergency kit

- •Consider helping neighbours or community members who may need It doesn't matter if you are staying or leaving, having an emergency kit can save precious time during an emergency.
 - Everyone in the household should know where the emergency kit is kept.
 - Your kit should include essential supplies such as an AM/FM battery powered radio, spare batteries, torch, first aid kit, woollen blanket, protective clothing, emergency contact numbers, important documents, water and non-perishable
 - On the day, don't forget to add essentials such as your wallet/purse, car and house keys, medications and medical equipment, phone and charger, and pet supplies.

Prepare your property

Simple and ongoing monthly property upkeep includes:

- Cut the grass around your property to 10cm or less
- Prune shrubs so they are not dense
- Clean gutters
- Check gas release valves face away from property More lasting actions to prepare your property include:
- · Create a minimum two metre gap between your house and tree branches
- Install metal fly wire mesh on all windows and vents and install a protective screen on evaporative air conditioners.
- Block any gaps under the floor, in roof spaces, under eaves. external vents, skylights, chimneys and wall claddings.
- Install a fire or heat radiant shield such as a solid fence.

Volunteer Bush Fire Brigades

Would you like to become a Volunteer Fire Fighter? Then why not join one of the Shire of Dardanup's 8 Volunteer Bush Fire Brigades and learn how to prevent fires and be trained in fire fighting! Volunteer Bush Fire Brigades protect the community, as well as attend fires all around the state and at times across the country. Male and female volunteers are very welcome. No experience is necessary as all training is provided. There are many dimensions to being a volunteer bush fire fighter and members are encouraged to choose the type of activities that best suit their capabilities and interest.

Volunteers are trained in the following areas:

- personal and team safety and survival
- fire suppression methods
- vehicle driving on and off road
- communications
- first aid

leadership and emergency management procedures.

If you don't feel you are up to fighting fires, you may want to consider joining a brigade's support team. The support team's main functions are to help our fire fighters and cadets with technical and welfare support during an incident, or during training and fundraising.

Some of our brigades also have a strong cadet program and welcomes boys and girls from the age of 11 to 16 years to join. Being a cadet provides an opportunity for young people to learn about fire safety, fire equipment and develop important life skills through team exercises and leadership challenges.

Being a volunteer is a rewarding experience. It is an opportunity to meet new people, learn new skills and provide assistance in protecting your community. Respecting others, working together as a team and acting with honesty and integrity are the values embraced by members.

All burning in the open is prohibited from 15 December until 14 March each year (subject to change).

Register your mobile for SMS Messages

The Shire of Dardanup has implemented an SMS Notification Service for Total Fire Ban & Harvest & Vehicle Movement Bans, as well as information relating to restricted/prohibited burning periods. As soon as a Total Fire Ban or Harvest & Vehicle Movement Ban is called, all mobile phones registered will receive an SMS directly to their mobile phone. This service is free of charge. Firebreaks & Fire Prevention Measures

Fire prevention measures must be completed and all properties (including residential, commercial, industrial and vacant land) cleared of fire hazards on or before 30 November each year to reduce the risk of fires during the bushfire season. Properties must remain free of hazard until the close of the Restricted Burning Period.

Which fire zone are you?

Did you know our Shire is made up of two fire zones? Geographe and Brockman.

Do you know which fire zone your property is located?
An interactive map can be found on the Shires website that can show you whether your property is located in the Geographe or Brockman zones. All you have to do is type your address in the search function to find out.

These fire zones were announced by the Bureau of Meteorology (BOM) and the Shire of Dardanup will continue to communicate with residents on any future Fire Danger Ratings set
