Eaton Foreshore plan survey open

The Shire of Dardanup is inviting residents to provide feedback on a new concept plan that outlines a vibrant and exciting future for one of the community's most loved public spaces – the Eaton Foreshore.

The draft Eaton Foreshore Concept Plan was developed in collaboration between Council and the Eaton Foreshore Working Group – a collection of key stakeholders and community representatives who brought local knowledge and passion to the table.

Shire President Cr Tyrrell Gardiner said the concept plan represents a shared vision for the precinct that aims to balance recreation, events, sport and natural beauty. "This is your chance to help shape the future of the Eaton Foreshore. I encourage everyone to take a look at the plan and share their thoughts," Cr Gardiner said.

"The Eaton Foreshore has always been a special place for our community – a place where families gather, children play, and events bring people together.

"Through the Working Group, we've heard from passionate locals and sporting groups about what they love and what could make this space even better."

There are 38 proposed improvements in the plan, based on the Eaton Place Plan 2023 with input from the Working Group and the Shire. Cr Gardiner said once all community feedback has been received, it will be reviewed and incorporated into a final version of the concept plan, which will be presented to Council for consideration at the June 2025 Ordinary Council Meeting.

Greener grounds ahead

You may have noticed an earthy smell in the Shire recently. The Shire has undertaken essential topdressing works on Eaton Oval and Glen Huon Oval, using an organic-based compost to improve turf and soil health, reduce chemical use, and protect waterways. The smell will fade as irrigation resumes. Thanks for your patience as we care for our community ovals!



APRIL 2025 Green Waste Collection from 12-21 May

Get ready for the Shire's Green Waste Kerbside Collection, which is back this autumn, giving residents the chance to tidy up their gardens and responsibly dispose of green waste.

Collection dates: Monday, 12 May until Wednesday, 21 May 2025.

What will be collected:

- Tree and shrub cuttings (up to 2 cubic metres).
- Maximum branch length: 1.5 metres.
- Maximum branch diameter: 200mm.

What won't be collected:

- Lawn clippings or roll-on turf.
- Green waste in bags or boxes.
- Hard waste (e.g. timber).
- Stumps.
- Piles larger than 2 cubic metres.

The Shire's Green Waste Kerbside Collection will be conducted between 12-21 May 2025.

Important reminders:

- All green waste must be placed on the verge before 6am on Monday, 12 May.
- Waste should be kept clear of reticulation, water mains, electrical domes, footpaths, street signs and street corners.
- 100% of green waste collected is recycled into compost – helping your garden and our environment!

- Streets will only be serviced once. Waste placed out after the collection or in an incorrect manner will not be collected and must be removed by the property owner or occupier.
- Council cannot provide specific collection times or dates for individual streets.

Let's work together to keep our Shire clean, green, and beautiful this autumn!
