The facilities at the Dardanup Equestrian Centre, are second to none, with the ability to run x 6 clinicians at one time, doing horsemanship and cattle work simultaneously.

Also visiting from Victoria was Shannon Williams-Browne who is the instigator of these events, together with Sandra Beirs, from NSW who volunteer with the national Classic Ladies Foundation, these ladies participate and support these events all over Australia, they were delighted to be in Dardanup and sung praises for our facility and the camaraderie of participants and tireless work by the campdraft club.

Sixty two participants, spent the day on Saturday learning from the clinicians, specialising in horsemanship, Campdrafting and Challenging. A day of soaking up knowledge, meeting new friends, being with long time, like minded friends and loving being on horseback, meanwhile club members, cleaned, thankyou, Susan Peace, cooked and prepared for a night of spectacle under the stars.

Under the shady verandah we shared lunch and had a visit from Sarah Russell Senior Philanthropic Partnerships Manager from Sydnes and Michell, a Cancer Care nurse from Bunbury, who took time to talk, self care and awareness of preventative measures surrounding breast care.

Saturday night, participants, club members, clinicians, special guests were invited to join in the most hilarious "Op Shop Hideous" cocktail party, fun was had by all, with terrific catwalk moves, and so many great op shop buys, good music, the perfect recipe for a fun night filled with loads of laughter.

The DEC was transformed into an open air amphitheatre, complete with lights and a formal dinner setting. A home cooked delight, provided by the Campdraft Club, cooked by the tireless and very

talented Ruve Tyler, with the help with sweets from Jacquie Dalstrom and Carol Clark.

Special Guest speaker Lyn Fraser, one of campdrafts long time members, who is a breast cancer survivor, a nurse and most importantly a Mum and wife. With the help of her long term friend, Sally Browne, Lyn was able to share her journey with breast cancer, how it affected her family and the importance of her husbands support.

Still not enough, while the busy fairies, Freya Kerr and Anne Lasini worked the kitchen, doing the dishes, the auction got under way to help raise funds, and with the greatest thanks to generous local business, and individuals personal generosity, we were able to auction goods so varied, from the very popular bird bath, to hand tooled handbags and sire service fees. The auction raised \$12,662 of much appreciated support. The infamous Tiny Holly, entertained the crowd and sold the items, as the cold easterly and tired bodies were tempting the ladies to their beds.

Finally the cold night air took its toll and we retired our weary bodies, only to join up in the early morning for breakfast and another day of cattlework and tuition, while members from the Dardanup Campdraft club packed away the frivolities and restored the DEC to its glory. Thankful for the big trees and sunshine that bought everyone together for a last lunch, thankyous, prizes, and some farewells.

Congratulations to the Dardanup Campdraft Club, all the members and the Committee Michael Dell-Agostino, Ruve Tyler, Tim and Zoe Prosser, for hosting this event, only a week before one of our major annual campdrafts, such an amazing group of individuals, working together, to create great things and while the final amount is still not finalised, we do know that this event has raised over \$28,000 to be donated to the McGrath Foundation. December is the beginning of the Noongar season of **Birak** and is known as the first summer. *In a 'normal' year...* We can expect less rain and warmer weather, with wind patterns that are predictably and predominately Easterly in the morning and Westerly in the

afternoon. As it heats up, my shade-cloth goes up and I garden in the cool morning or early evening after dinner.

Seedlings have been a bit scarce of late and the selection available has been a bit limited, so why not start some seeds at home. It is easier than you think, gives you more choice and saves you money one 6pk punnet of lettuce seedlings is equal to a packet of 200 lettuce seeds! There are some wonderful WA seed sellers - Thrive Sustainability, Down2Earth, Harvest ME & Yilgarn Seeds. Have a look in your local Hardware or Garden centres or even enquire at your local Community Garden - Thommos' Community Garden in Bunbury sell their own seeds and plants.

My top tips for seed starting and transplanting are: 1. Make sure all your pots, trays and containers are clean. Reuse what you have on hand, strawberry punnets make great mini hot houses! Hot soapy water is fine, then rinse and dry. 2. Fill your containers with goodquality moist seed raising mix - potting mix is ok, just remove any large pieces of bark. It is a good idea to leave a centimetre or two space at the top for easy watering. 3. Plant the seeds, several in one pot - A good rule is to cover them with the same amount of soil as the size of the seed, it is better to be too shallow rather than too deep. Sprinkle tiny seeds on top and water in. Some seeds benefit from being soaked prior to sowing (up to 12 hrs is fine). It will help speed up the germination for peas, beans, corn, beetroot and silverbeet seeds. 4. Water the containers moderately, and let them free drain. You don't want to drown your seeds so this first watering should be ok for the first week until the seeds emerge. Most seeds will germinate within 7-10 days. Put the containers out of direct sunlight, so that the young seedlings don't scorch or dry out. 5. Once the seedlings have germinated, keep the soil moist (not waterlogged). They need light and airflow to make sure the stems are strong and they don't get 'leggy'. When the seedlings have their first true leaves, you can start transplanting them out to the garden. Any 'extras' can be separated at planting or snip off the weaker ones with scissors so the roots aren't disturbed. 6. Before planting out, if they have been grown indoors you will need to 'harden them off' or get them used to the outside environment. Ideally you would take them outdoors and put them in a sheltered spot for a few days before planting them out. Mine are grown in an outdoor greenhouse, so I plant them out late afternoon to give them overnight to settle in before the heat of the next day, water them in with a seaweed solution to reduce transplant shock and give them a bit of shade for the first week. I have added some shade-cloth to a few old dog bed frames and they act like mini shade houses for my seedlings. *Note:* be gentle with your seedlings and always plant them into moist soil. Summer is the season when I grow a wide variety of crops, focussing on the ones that we eat more regularly, store well and can be transformed into salsas, sauces and pickles - condiments, herbs and spices are expensive to buy but much tastier and cheaper

to make at home. Regardless of your space it is very important to

rationalise what you grow. 'Grow what you like to eat and Eat what you grow' sounds fairly obvious but it is easy to fall into the trap of wanting to grow everything!

Water and Time are precious commodities over the summer period.

Some vegetables are relatively cheap to purchase in bulk and/or

require large growing areas (such as carrots, onions) so consider buying those and focussing on other crops. Garlic and Turmeric are high yielding and expensive (\$60/kg) so well worth growing at home. Spring/Summer is the time to plant Ginger and Turmeric. One good sized knob of ginger planted now should yield about 1kg in April, Turmeric will give you a better harvest if left for 2 years but you will still be able to harvest some 'fingers' in the Autumn/Winter months. How to plant: Find some nice pieces of ginger / turmeric at your local grocer/farmers market or rescue the ones sprouting/withering away in the bottom of your fridge drawer. They don't have to be organically grown but definitely make sure they are grown in Australia. Wide pots are best as they grow outwards, spreading like outstretched fingers and a cheap and cheerful option is a large styrofoam box with drain holes poked 3cm up the sides from the base. They are heavy feeders so fill your pot/ container with good quality potting mix. Place the rhizome flat and cover with a soil (same depth as the rhizome). They like to be moist but not waterlogged and keep them in a sheltered spot away from the afternoon heat. It might take a couple of weeks before they sprout and leaves begin to show (turmeric is slower growing) and let them grow through until late autumn before harvesting. *In my garden...* The garlic has been harvested making room for Sweet corn, Beans (for both fresh eating and dried), tomatoes of all shapes and sizes, Pumpkins, Zucchini and plenty of salad greens! A new planting of Silverbeet, Spring onions and Parsley seedlings are getting ready to replace the winter ones going to seed. I have been pinching out the tops of my basil plants to make them bush out so they produce more and planting more seeds every couple of weeks. My tip for keeping your garden abundant is to keep planting! You still have time to plant more of your favourite summer crops. Here are a few suggestions for What to plant in December and January. Leaf crops: Amaranth, Lettuce, Mustard, Silverbeet, Fennel, Celery, Watercress, Purslane, Rocket, French Cress, Sorrel, NZ spinach, Chicory, Cabbage and Chinese cabbage. Root & onion crops: Beetroot, Radish, Kohlrabi, Carrot, Parsnip, Scorzonera, Potato, Leeks, Spring Onions, Yacon, Yam/Oca and Jerusalem artichokes. Legume crops: Climbing Beans, Dwarf Beans and Asparagus pea. Curcubit & Solanum family: Choko, Cucumber, Luffa, Sweetcorn, Melons, Pumpkin, Squash, Marrow, Zucchini, Tomato, Capsicum, Chilli, Tomatillo, Eggplant, Rosella and Sunflowers. Herbs: Basil, Strawberry plants, Dill, Borage, Nasturtium, Oregano, Sage, Cape Gooseberry, Mint, Tarragon, Lemon Balm, Edible Chrysanthemum, Parsley, Rhubarb, Rosemary, Summer savoury, Horseradish and Chives.

Summer is a busy time - holidays, family and longer daylight hours for gardening! I hope you take time to enjoy your summer garden and cook up a storm with your homegrown produce. Wishing everyone a very Merry Festive Season and Happy New Year. Until next year, *Happy Gardening*!




