Exhibition and Art Trail Weekend Gearing Up

\$12,500.00 in prize money will be awarded to winning and highly commended artists in this years

Dardanup Art

Spectacular to be held over the weekend of the 5th and 6th April. \$3000 awarded to the Open prize winner, \$2000 for the Theme winner, \$750 for the Photography winner plus other prizes of \$1000 and includes \$300 awarded to Secondary School students in the general art category and photography. Categories for adult artists are Open, Emerging(Shire of Dardanup resident only), Portrait, Theme(Reverse Ekphrasis), 3D and Photography.

In 2025 the Art Spectacular Committee sold over \$12,000.00 in art with a commission received on sales.

The annual Dardanup Art Spectacular is organised by the community of Dardanup and sponsored by the Shire of Dardanup to showcase the work of emerging artists in the Shire as well as art exhibited from the wider community. The Art Spectacular relies on the generosity of our corporate sponsors and local businesses to ensure the success of this annual event.

The Opening Night is a must attend event on Dardanups social calendar, also a fundraiser for Dardanup P&C who cater for the evening as well as supervise the art exhibition over the weekend.

Have a Water Flow Issue in Dardanup Townsite?

Then we want to hear from you. Recently Jill Cross and Jenny Trigwell, representing Dardanup Residents Assoc and community residents, Gary Power and Tonia Dau, attended a meeting at the Shire with the CEO Andre Schonfeldt and Shire President Tyrrell Gardiner to find out what the Shires knows about the water flow issues around the town and to assist and direct us to who we should be contacting with our concerns. For quite some time the Water Corporation have said that the water flow measurement in Dardanup complies with what is the standard for country urban areas. Many in this town believe the flow rate is far below this standard and is terrible in many parts of the town with residents not being able to reticulate or even adequately shower. Not to mention there are now 19 lots sold on the southern side of town with another 72 lots under active development now, which will put more pressure on the water system.

So to support our case when we complain to State Govt Ministers and Water Corp we need evidence of the poor water flow in this town. So heres what you can do -

- take videos of your sprinklers and the water coming (or not coming!) from your hose, taps, shower.
- measure the water coming out of the closest tap to your water meter. (Disconnect hose, tap timer)

Bucket Test (Flow Rate):

Turn off all water sources.

Turn the front garden tap on fully.

Place a bucket (e.g., 10L) under the running tap for 30 seconds. Use a stop watch, timer etc.

Measure the water collected and multiply by 2 to get flow litres per minute.

Meter Reading flow test

Make sure all taps are turned off and write down all the black and red numbers on your meter.

Turn on front garden tap for 60 seconds.

Read meter again and subtract from the first reading to get litres per minute flow.

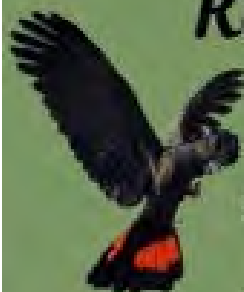

With a growing team and expanded services, *Dardanup Health and Wellness Centre* continues to play an important role in supporting the health needs of the local community.



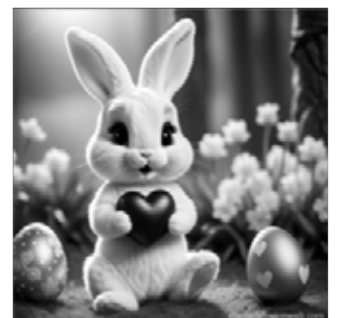
Massage therapist Cheyenne

Throughout the term, the classroom has been buzzing with curiosity as students explored big ideas such as gravity, rockets and space travel. The children began by drawing rockets and aliens, creating asteroids and stars, and imagining what might exist in outer space. They then designed their own rockets using recycled materials before carefully building them in class. Just when the students thought they knew everything that was happening in our space inquiry, they arrived at school one morning to discover a surprise! A mysterious spaceship had landed right in our classroom. The unexpected arrival sparked huge excitement and curiosity, inspiring imaginative play, storytelling and many questions about who might have travelled to Earth.



A highlight of the inquiry was a visit from **Colin from Brain Spice in Bunbury**, who joined us to extend our learning in a fun and exciting way. Colin ran a fantastic water rocket demonstration that combined water and air pressure to launch the rockets. This was enjoyed by students across the school, with many classes coming out to watch the launch. The rockets soared impressively high, reaching measured heights of 31 metres and 28 metres, much to the excitement of the crowd. One memorable moment was when our Principal, Anthea Patten, was launched on one of the rockets, a moment that had the children and staff laughing and cheering. Our space inquiry has encouraged students to ask questions, explore new ideas and develop a sense of curiosity about the world around them. April is the beginning of the Noongar season **Djeran**. Autumn is here, the Magpies song has changed and there is dew on the grass in the mornings. We are still waiting on the rain but the warm days

means we still have time to get our gardens planted out. Prices of everything continue to go up and our gardens are a place for us to be proactive and productive! Use what you have, up-cycle what you can and plant with intention - if you are limited on space choose seasonal plants that give you good yields and repeat harvests. Focus on growing the crops your family enjoys eating, the ones that can be difficult to source or expensive to buy and ones that give you more than one harvest per plant.

Grow your “Staples” - These are a variety of reliable, easy to grow and nutrient dense crops. Most can be grown in very little space and are great for providing you with a large amount of food.

My favourite year round staples include Herbs, Silverbeet, Spring onions, Beetroot, Lettuce/Greens, Radish and Carrots. In winter, I add Broccoli, Cauliflower, Cabbage, Peas, Broad beans, Kale and Spinach to my patch. These aren't the only crops I grow but I do make an effort to focus on these, giving me a good amount of food to use in my meals and to put some in the freezer. As autumn continues it is time to harvest our storage crops that have been growing over the summer months, this includes our pumpkins, potatoes, sweet potatoes and the last of our tomatoes and beans.

What to plant now? Quickest harvest - Sprouts and Micro-greens can be ready within a week! Radish, rocket and lettuce can be harvested within a month. **Highest yield and best value for space** - Herbs, Silverbeet, Lettuce/Greens, Peas and Kale. Peas come in both dwarf and climbing varieties and are separated into 3 main types. Shelling types like ‘Telephone’, ‘Greenfeast’ and ‘Purple podded Dutch’ give you peas like the kind you buy in the frozen section of the supermarket but take about 14 weeks to produce. Snow peas (*mange-tout*) come in a range of colours and sizes. ‘Yukomo Giant’ and ‘Melting Mammoth’ Snow peas grow to almost 2m in height and take approx. 10 weeks before harvest. There is a more dwarf variety of Snow pea that will grow less than 1m and harvested in 6-7 weeks. Sugar Snap types such as ‘Oregon Sugar’, ‘Cascadia’ and ‘Sugar Bon’ can be harvested in 8 weeks and you can eat the whole sweet pod. The trick to increasing the yield is to pick them often and you can sow another lot when your first ones begin to flower to keep your harvest going all winter.

What to plant in April?

Leaf crops - Celery, Cress, Collard greens, Chicory, Endive, Lettuce, Mizuna, Choi Sum, Gai Lan, Pak Choy, Chinese Cabbage, Mustard greens, Rocket, Spinach, Silverbeet, Radicchio, Witlof and Corn salad. **Brassica crops (seedlings only*)** - Broccoli, Broccoli Raab, Brussel Sprouts, Cabbage, Cauliflower and Kale. **Root crops** - Beetroot, Carrot, Radish, Daikon, Celeriac, Kohlrabi, Salsify, Swede, Turnip. **Legume crops** - Broad Beans, Snow peas and Peas. **Onion family** - Garlic, Leeks, Spring onions, Onions, Potato onions, Tree onions and Shallots. **Herbs** - Artichoke, Bay, Chives, Coriander, Fennel, Lemon Balm, Mint, Rosemary, Oregano, Parsley, Rosemary, Sage, Thyme and Burdock.

April is a month for pruning and tidying up spent summer crops. Think of this as your way of creating *free fertility*. Make a weed tea, build a compost heap and if you have access to a mulcher, try to chip/shred as many of your prunings as possible. Smaller sized pieces break down faster in the compost heap and chunkier bits save you money on buying mulch for your perennials. Pruning your fruit trees now will shape your trees for next season and help to promote good fruiting. While it isn't as easy to see all the branches with the leaves still on, it will limit the crazy growth that happens when you winter prune dormant trees.

For any beds that you aren't going to plant with winter vegies or any bare patches in your chook pen or orchard consider planting a Green manure Crop. This helps to replenish the soil, feeding the microbes while acting as a living mulch and suppressing weeds. You can purchase an Autumn mix from most stockfeed stores and selected garden centres. My favourite cost effective choice is Broad beans. They are a fabulous nitrogen fixing green manure with the bonus of beans to eat and tender top shoots that are yummy stir-fried. Happy planting!
