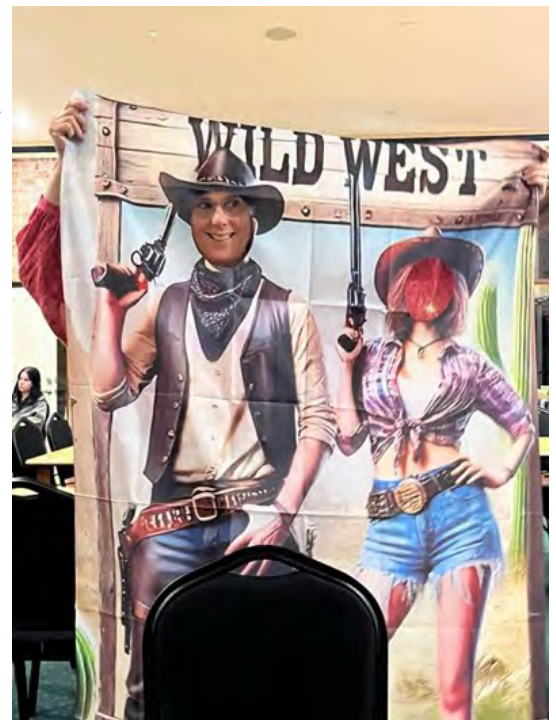

Have Your Say At Community Meetings This May

The Shire of Dardanup is inviting residents to attend its annual Community Meetings, a chance to connect directly with Councillors and Council staff, share feedback, and help shape the future of the community.

This year's meetings carry extra significance, with feedback from attendees directly informing the development of the Shire's new Strategic Community Plan, a key document that will guide Council's priorities and decision-making for years to come.

Your voice has already made a difference.

In the 2025 MARKYT Community Scorecard, nearly 900 residents shared their feedback, helping the Shire rank second among regional councils in WA and eighth overall out of more than 70 councils across Australia.

The results highlighted strong satisfaction across community engagement, local roads, planning, and youth and seniors' services, and identified key priorities for the community including housing affordability, community safety, and waste management.

Our 2026 Community Meetings are the next step in that conversation.

Shire President Cr Tyrrell Gardiner encouraged all residents to attend a meeting in their area.

"Our Community Meetings are one of the most valuable opportunities we have to hear directly from the people who live and work in our Shire," Cr Gardiner said.

"This year, your input is especially important. The feedback we receive will help shape our new Strategic Community Plan, so we want to hear from as many residents as possible about what matters most to them."

Meetings will be held across locations throughout May 2026. Meetings schedule: All meetings will run from 5.30pm to 6.30pm.

"We also want to remind our community that feedback is welcome year-round," Cr Gardiner said.

Got rabbits? Persistence is Key for Effective Management

Rabbits remain one of Australia's most destructive invasive pests – costing our economy around \$200 million every year, threatening more than 320 native species, and degrading landscapes across two-thirds of the continent.

Local Action: LBG's Calicivirus RHDV1-K5 Release Program

Our local Leschenault Biosecurity Group (LBG) continually collaborates with private landholders across our area to support effective rabbit management on their properties.

Key Rabbit Control Strategy Considerations

- **Persistence is essential** - "One-off" efforts produce only short-term results as rabbit populations can recover quickly even after successful control programs.
- **Rabbits breed rapidly** - complete elimination of rabbits is close to impossible. It estimated that two rabbits can multiply to around 185 rabbits in just 18 months!
- **Timing matters** - Late summer when rabbit numbers are decreasing and feed is limited, is often the best time for effective control

- **Integrated control methods are KEY**- Maximum effectiveness is achieved by integrating appropriate, property-specific control methods.
- **Working together works better** – collaboration with neighbours and broader coordinated community-wide control strategies can greatly reduce numbers and the problem of re-infestation by covering a large area.

Leschenault Biosecurity Group can assist landholders with practical advice, equipment loan and support to develop an integrated management approach using a variety of control methods and tools. Community members are encouraged to contact the group to discuss what rabbit management options may be best for your property at this time of year.

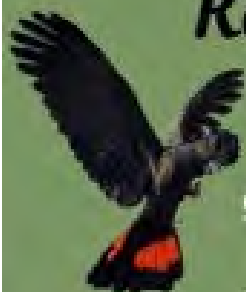

West Dardanup Volunteer Bushfire Brigade

With the high fire risk period now drawing to an end, it will allow the Brigade time to get out in the community, meet some of the newer residents and review the areas within the brigade boundary that are of higher fire risk, so we are able to prepare for next season.

The West Dardanup area, which is located west of the Boyanup Picton Rd to Wilman Wadandi Hwy and from Poad Rd to Harris Rd in Picton East has recently seen a lot of development particularly relating to the development of small holdings. The increase in this type of development results in higher asset risk for the brigade.

During the coming months, the Brigade will try to contact as many new property owners in the area as possible to make them aware of the bushfire information available to assist with establishing a fire wise garden and how to undertake planned burns in a safe and responsible manner.

As the Brigade area is continuing to develop, the Brigade members will also be able to provide information and answer questions on how people are able to become involved in the Bushfire Brigade.

Joining a brigade will also enable you to learn new skills, develop existing skills and build friendships while becoming more involved in your community.

May is the second half of the Noongar Season *Djeran*. It is usually the time when the first regular rains come, we begin to experience cooler mornings with dew and there is a chill in the air.

Cyclone Narelle brought wind and rain in varying amounts across our region last month. On our farm we recorded an extra 50mm of rain for the monthly average. My garden loves the rain - the plants perk up and look greener than they do when I water everyday. However, Weeds also like the rain and now I have a lush crop...

Anyone else got a few weeds? Don't worry, you are right on track because May is *Composting Month!* It is the perfect time to Utilise all those greens, any fallen leaves, old mulch, spent hay and chipped up garden prunings to make some homegrown fertility. There are a variety of ways to suit all garden sizes including hot heaps, compost tumblers, Johnson-Su bioreactors and even the cold heap hidden behind the garden shed. If you need some help getting started or ideas on how to make it less of a chore, book in for this months free Sustainable Living Workshop at the Dardanup Hall or check out my upcoming Composting workshops at the Bunbury Library and Milligan House.

Our gardens can be an asset in uncertain or challenging times. Regardless of the size of your 'garden' Growing some of your own Groceries can save you money.

Growing seasonally increases flavour and reduce pest issues. There are also a few staples that can be grown year round to give reliable and nutrient dense crops to bulk out our meals. Greens are my #1 year round staple in the garden. They are one of the most heavily sprayed crops when grown commercially, so it is definitely worth growing your own Parsley, Silverbeet (Swiss Chard), Kale, Spinach, Mustard Greens and Rocket. These are cut and come again so you give you a high yeild for your space.

One of the most recently used buzz words around food is Nutrient dense - *What does that really mean?* Essentially they are foods that provide us with high levels of vitamins, minerals, antioxidants and fibre. There is a plethora of lists and articles on the internet.

Dardanup Heritage Collective News Stories of Dardanup Clubs & Organisations

The towns and localities of the Dardanup Shire all had active social and sporting organisations from the earliest days of settlement. Some of the stories of these groups now appear on the Dardanup Heritage Collective's web site. A recent addition was the history of the Dardanup Lions Club since 1972, thanks to the input of David Wells and others. Early stories of the Lions are shared and visitors can download annual dinner programs.

The site also includes histories of some sporting clubs and documents from more recent organisations like the Dardanup & Districts Residents' Association and the Dardanup Bull & Barrel Festival.

Each vegie/crop has varying amounts of protein, carbohydrates, vitamins/minerals and fibre. As a home gardener, I am interested in what we can easily grow in our vegie patch to help fill these needs and nourish our families. Here are a few winter vegies that give you good amounts of Protein (approx. grams/cup) - Broadbeans (12g), Green peas (8g), Spinach (6g), Brussel sprouts (3g), Broccoli (4g), Potato (4g) and Kale (3g). A few high Carbohydrate/Starch sources (approx. grams/cup) that are easy to grow at home include Potato (27g), Sweet potato (27g), Taro (27g), Parsnip (24g), Jerusalem artichoke/Sunchoke (17g), Carrot (12g) and Queensland Arrowroot (12g). While Pumpkin (16g) isn't grown in winter, it is ready to harvest now and store/eat over the winter months.

There is still time to get your winter vegies in the garden, but you will need to plant seedlings (not seeds) of the longer season crops such as Broccoli, Cauliflower, Celery, Cabbage and Kales to make sure you get a harvest before summer.

Plant now: Leaf crops - Celery, Cress, Collard greens, Chicory, Endive, Lettuce, Mizuna, Choi Sum, Gai Lan, Pak Choy, Chinese Cabbage, Mustard greens, Rocket, Spinach, Silverbeet, Radicchio, Witlof and Corn salad. Brassica crops (seedlings only*)-Broccoli, Broccoli Raab, Brussel Sprouts, Cabbage, Cauliflower and Kale. Root crops - Beetroot, Carrot, Radish, Daikon, Celeriac, Kohlrabi, Salsify, Swede, Turnip. Legume crops - Broad Beans, Snow peas and Peas. Onion family - Garlic, Leeks, Spring onions, Onions, Potato onions, Tree onions and Shallots. Herbs - Artichoke, Bay, Chives, Coriander, Fennel, Lemon Balm, Mint, Rosemary, Oregano, Parsley, Rosemary, Sage, Thyme and Burdock.

Grow what you like to eat and whatever the size of your harvest, every bit helps. Happy Gardening!

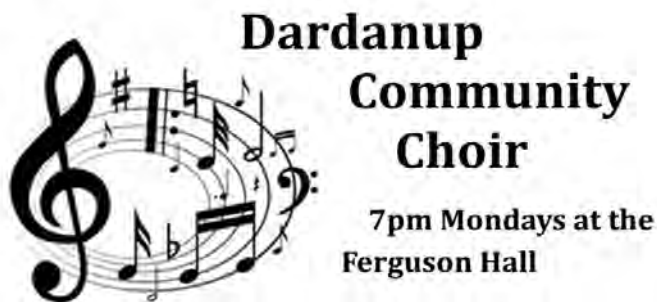
